**Tracing Egypt  
In Australia**

DARWIN, Australia, Nov. 16—(CP-Reuters)—An ancient "Stonehenge" with caves containing remarkable primitive paintings and grisly relics, has been found in the Australian bush, about 300 miles from Darwin.

The discovery was made by a Northern Territory expedition, led by Hugh Stuart, collecting material for projected exhibitions showing wealth and early history of North Australia. It may support the theory of the "Children of the Sun," said to have gone from

Egypt to all quarters of the globe. On a grassy plateau the party found an extraordinary group of cave temples. Towering abruptly above the long white grass was a group of majestic sandstone outcrops ranged in a wide amphitheatre about a mile in circumference. The rocks, almost black with age, rose in a series of individual masses 30 to 50 feet high. Most dominating of the group has several large protruding overhangs like huge cowls. Each cowl covered a cave in which were found a series of brilliant paintings, believed to be hundreds of years old. Two enormous figures in red, yellow, white and black, clearly representing a king and

queen, were the most important of which includes kangaroo, serpents, a varied and interesting collection of fish, crabs, boomerangs and phallic symbols. Stuart wrote: "The royal pair are elaborately clothed from head to foot and the king has a magnificent, sun-like head-dress suggesting eastern influence. A notable fact is that the sign of the cross appears upon the breast of each figure." Further investigation of the caves showed that they were full of symbolism and ghoulish relics, including two shinbones and smaller human remains, some painted red.

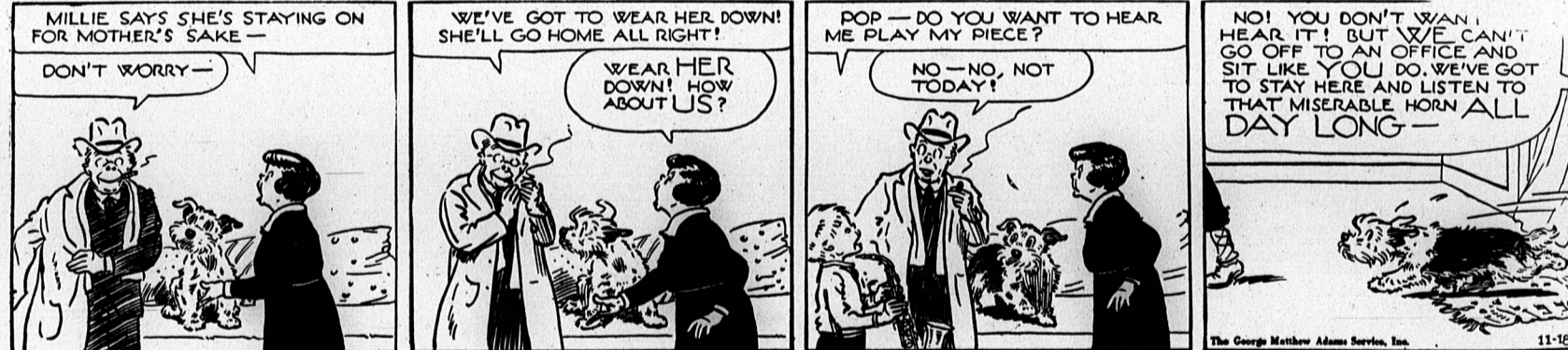
