CAPE BALANCO WRECK DECADE OLD

LONDON, May 17 (Special).—The identity of the steamship reported to be ashore at Cape Blanco, Africa, is still a mystery. A despatch to Lloyd's from Dakar reports that the steamship was one of the Union Castle Company, but the officials of that company have accounted for all their steamships with the exception of the Kenilworth Castle, which was reported at Maderia on May 7.

It is not considered possible that this steamship could be ashore and abandoned on May 10, as reported by the steamship which is alleged to have seen the wreck. It is thought that the wreck off Cape Balanco is the French cruiser Conde, abandoned there a decade ago.

AMERICAN MISSION GOING TO SPAIN

ROME, May 17 (Special).—The American commission which is engaged in the study of agricultural co-operation in Europe has completed its work here. Prince Boncompagni-Ludovisi, a large Italian landholder, and Senator Calabroni Pianchoni, Spanish Ambassador to the Vatican, explained the systems in Italy and Spain.

The latter's explanation of rural credit in his country proved so interesting that the commission decided to go to Spain. In the meantime, however, the American delegates, in three groups, left for a trip to North, West and Central Italy respectively.

ONTARIO BANK CLEARER OF MURDER CHARGE

HAMILTON, Ont., May 15.—Word was received here to-day of the acquittal on a charge of murder at Kamloops, B. C., of Rex Fleak, a former Hamilton bank clerk, whose relatives reside here. Fleak was arrested several months ago with another man, charged with shooting a railway man named Richeson. A true bill has just been returned against another man who was arrested later.

WELL KNOWN RAILWAY MAN IS DEAD.

MONTREAL, Que., May 15.—The death occurred here today of Mr. Wm. Edward Davies, passenger traffic manager of the Grand Trunk Railway, after a brief illness. He was one of the oldest and best known men in the Dominion. Born on August 2, 1850, at Wilson, N. Y., he entered the railway service as clerk in 1868 on the Hannibal and St. Joseph road, entering the Grand Trunk employ in 1877 and steadily advancing to the position he occupied at the time of his death.

DOG GUARDS ILL MISTRESS.

RAWLINS, Wyo., May 15.—Mrs. Mary West, for the last year the only dweller in the deserted town of Carbon, once a prosperous coal camp with 1,500 population, was brought to the county hospital here today. She was found in a critical condition from starvation, having been helpless from illness since May 3. Beside her when she was found was an aged dog, which she said had guarded her and had not left the room since she was awarded ill.

BISHOP WILL CELEBRATE HIS SILVER JUBILEE.

QUEBEC, May 6.—Mgr. Mathieu, Bishop of Regina, Sask., is in Quebec to attend the twenty-fifth anniversary of Mgr. Begin's consecration. Mgr. Stagni, Apostolic Delegate, is expected to assist at the celebration, afterwards leaving for his annual tour of Western Canada. He will bless the new seminary built by Mgr. Langevin, at St. Boniface, Man., on June 18, afterwards going to Regina to bless the new cathedral in course of construction there.

HORSE NOTES.

—In another column will be found the ad of the Clydesdale Stallion Royal Darnley (13219) owned by R. B. McKinley, North River. A better combination of good blood would be hard to expect in Clydesdale lines, he being the son of Burgie Royal by Baron Burgie by Darnley, the undisputed champion of draft horses the world over.

He also was awarded first prize in a field of seven, obtaining the gold medal and sweepstakes as the best stallion of all ages Burgie Royal was also a noted prize winner as a three-year-old. He won first prize and championship at the Charlottetown Exhibition open to the Dominion, beating Baron Balgredin and Lord Dalmy. The dam of Royal Darnley is also a noted prize winner winning supreme honors at Toronto in the hands of Graham Bros. First prize and Silver Cup at Charlottetown by her present owner, the Hon. John Richards. Her sire, the son of the great Barons Pride, has also a very brilliant career arising at the Royal & Scotland and first at the Hogland in Aberdeen in the same year, first and championship at the Highland the next year.

In Canada he was first at Toronto for two years, first at Ottawa one year, first the International, Chicago. Thus it can be seen that Royal Darnley certainly inherits the great combination of good blood which he shows to a very marked degree. Weighing over 1600 pounds at two years and ten months, possessing good clean flinty bone and wide wearing feet with action like a hackney, qualities which should recommend him highly to the breeding public. MONGOLIAN AUTONOMY CONCEDED BY CHINA

LONDON, May 17 (Special).—A secret agreement between Russia and China was signed recently, according to the Pekin correspondent of the Daily Telegraph, under which China concedes complete autonomy to outer Mongolia, the frontier of which has been delimited.

This agreement, which the correspondent says is certain to create a storm throughout China when it becomes known, saves Koko and Uliassutal, besides all the Kirghiz country and extreme northwestern Mongolia. Autonomous Mongolia will measure more than half a million square miles, and no such surrender has been chronicled since 1898, when the Port Arthur and Kiao-Chau coups were recognized by treaty.

Little Montenegro, standing valiantly out against the United Powers in spite of battleships maneuvering before its single seaport and asking each other why this infant terrible isn't overawed, has attracted much attention among people who formerly couldn't have told you whether Montenegro was a country or a brand of imported cheese. The Marchioness of Donegal in Canada Monthly for May tells of her travels "Through Montenegro to Albanian Scutari" and gives a lively picture of the Montenegrins, who has led his troops in the field including King Nicholas, who at seventy has led his troops against the unpeakable Turk.

Hodgins in a Flag and a Song explains the history and meaning of the Union Jack; George O. Wallace writes about John Apt, Fisherman and Yachtsman, who holds the British Cup and sails the fastest fishing schooner out of Digby.

Bayre's story, The Cost of Success recounts a singer's debut and why she thought it a failure; Kit continues her Peddlars Pack and Robert Ames Bennet his adventure serial, Unwilling Eve, and there are other items of interest by T. A. Daly, Edgar Dumaray, Katherine Hale, Gordon Johnstone, and others.

SLIT SKIRT CALLED FRAUD AND CHEAT.

CHICAGO, Ill., May 15.—The naughty slash in the tight skirt was denounced as an "atrocity perpetrated on an intelligent nation by a people who themselves do not believe in or wear it," by members of the Chicago Dressmakers' Club at their annual banquet last night.

The slit, which is a French invention, also was referred to as a "fraud and a cheat" and the dress-makers asserted themselves for American fashions for American women.

They went on record as opposed to the slashed skirt and all similar designs which appeal to or suggest immorality.

ASKS CANADA TO MODIFY IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION

LONDON, May 15.—At a meeting of the Canadian Immigration Committee, held last night, attention was called to the Privy Council order which had been put into operation by the Dominion Government providing that no immigrant could land unless he came direct from his native country, and that there being no direct steamship service between India and Canada the effect of the order was to prohibit further immigration of British East Indians.
