Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may hereafter acquire a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

WINTER IS COMING

Winter may seem like a far cry from the middle of August but time speeds fast and those who delay in making their preparations will find themselves snowbound—with empty cellars and contrite hearts. It will be too late then to do any storing. The time to get ready is—now. Is your cellar in shape for storage? If not, get busy according to the following directions:

- (1) Select a suitable portion of your cellar.
- (2) Board it off from the rest of the cellar.
- (3) Cover the boards with felt paper. Do it on both sides of the partition to exclude the artificial heat from the furnace.
- (4) Provide a false floor for part of this room.
- (5) Nail a few slats on one of the walls.
- (6) Build a few bins on one side of the room.
- (7) Provide a few hooks in the ceiling.
- (8) Order a load of builders' sand and store it in one of the bins.
- (9) Provide a few flat boxes and old bags.

BACK FROM OVERSEAS

Private Benj. Poole of North Wiltshire, who left the Island in 1915 for Winnipeg where he enlisted in November of that year in the 90th Battalion popularly known as the "Little Black Devils" arrived in Charlottetown on Wednesday night. He is stopping for a few days at the Arlington Hotel on Great George Street before entering the P. E. Island Hospital to undergo further treatment for his wounds received in France.

Pte. Poole went to France in September 1916, after having put in three months in England. He took part in the big battle of the Somme and later moved up to Vimy Ridge where he was severely wounded by a rifle bullet in the back for which he had to undergo a number of operations. He spent a month in a stationary hospital in France and then was invalided to England, where he spent four months in the Imperial Hospital, Nottingham and nine months in the Duchess of Connaught Hospital at Taplow. He speaks in high terms of the kind treatment accorded him in the hospitals. He was then invalided to Canada—going to Winnipeg and at his own request was transferred from there to P. E. Island where he hopes to permanently reside. Private Poole was formerly on the P. E. Island Railway. His friend will be pleased to see him again and hope that he will soon be restored to his former vigor.
