MONTREAL, Oct. 6 (CP)—Montreal Livestock Markets displayed an unchanged price list today as all divisions remained steady.

Receipts: cattle, 188; calves 262, hogs, 893; sheep, 568. Good butcher cows brought \$3.25 to \$3.50 with medium \$2.50 to \$3 and common \$2 to \$2.50. Canners and cutters were \$1.50 to \$1.75 and common bulls \$2.50 to \$2.75. Veal calves traded at \$6 to \$8, common drinkers \$4.25 to \$4.50 and grassers \$3 to \$4. Good ewes and wethers brought \$7.50 with a cut of \$2 per hundred-weight on culs and bucks. Sheep were \$3 to \$4. Hogs were firm at \$8.50 for bacon, fed and watered, with selects drawing a premium of \$1. Butchers and heavies were \$8 with extra heavies \$7.50. Light hogs were \$7.50 to \$8 while sows traded at \$5.30 to \$6.25.

Graded egg shipments in cartons or less were quoted at 38 40 cents a dozen for a-large, 36 38 for a-medium, 27 28 for a-pullets, 24 25 for B and 21 21 1-2 for C. Butter was quoted at 24 cents a pound for cartons or less of no. 1 while lots to retailers were 25 for solids and 25 1-2 for prints. Cheese averaged 14 1-4 3-4 cents per pound for Ontarios. TORONTO, Oct. 6 (CP)—The Toronto Mining share market churned about within a narrow range today and closed practically at Monday's final level. The golds had more narrow losses than gains. The list developed mild heaviness but prices tightened before the close, particularly in the Base Metals. Hudson Bay reduced the loss to 1-8, Noranda, Falconbridge and Sudbury Basin closed unchanged while Sherritt finished a few cents to the good. Chromium declined 14.

Brokers reported a little switching from the golds to the industrial share market. Wright Hargreaves was offered in volume at a loss of 10 to 7 65 and Teck Hughes held steady at 5.85. Dome lost 1-4, Pioneer gained 10 and Lake Shore and Hollinger added 1-4 each. McIntyre closed at 39 for broken lots unchanged. O'Brien gained 40 in the secondary golds. Pamour followed with a gain of 15, Buffalo-Ankerite 15, McCleod-Cockshutt 30 Macassa 10 and San Antonio 10.

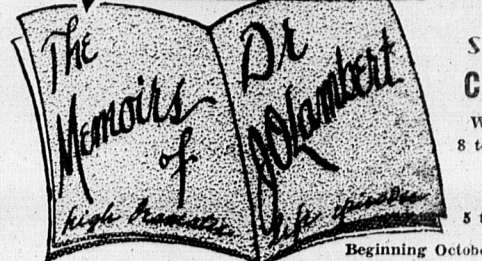
