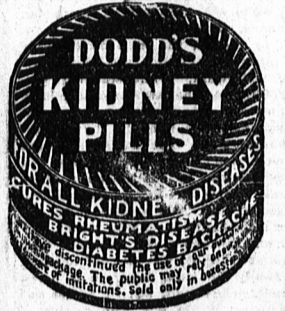

Four persons were received into full membership, at Kensington on the Margate Circuit on the evening of March 18th, and a larger number than usual partook of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at the close of the service, says The Wesleyan. The minister and family have recently moved in to the new parsonage which is located on the Margate Road nearly opposite the Episcopal Church on an excellent plot of land measuring 100x110 ft. The main house is 28x36, with an outside kitchen 12x16. In the hall, kitchen, dining-room and pantry are hardwood floors. The parlor and sitting-room are connected by folding doors, upstairs are four good sized bedrooms, a study and bath-room and the attic is finished with matched lumber. The barn measures 20x30 ft. Good progress is being made in raising money for the purpose. At present the indebtedness is about \$260 which amount is pretty well covered by subscriptions. A large amount of work has been done free of charge by the men of the circuit, some of whom deserve especial credit for the interest they have shown and the time spent in bringing the undertaking to completion. A committee is now at work making arrangements for grading fencing, etc., as soon as the Spring opens. Apart from furnishing the property will be worth fully \$2000. The house was built, by contract, Messrs. M. F. Schurman & Co. had the work in charge.



EXPLORER WALLACE AND PARTY SAFE

WILLIAMSTOWN, Mass., March 31.—A telegram was received here today from A. Dillon Wallace, the Labrador explorer, announcing his safe arrival with his companions, Eaton and Stanton, at Red Bay, after a successful trip by dog train along the coast from Ungava Bay. The telegram was as follows: "Just arrived at Red Bay. Eaton, Stanton and myself in good health. Fine trip down the coast. Start for home at once." Wallace and Eaton left Ungava Bay during the latter part of August 31st dog train, and at Red Bay picked up Stanton, who had taken the back trail out of the interior in order to bring back word of the party's progress.
