DOMINION DAY RAILWAY FACILITIES—Complaint has been made by a correspondent of the Patriot that the Railway authorities have unfairly discriminated against Murray Harbor district in the matter of excursion trains on Dominion Day. This is not so. It is not customary to run specials on Dominion Day except between Charlottetown and Summerside in connection with the races at the latter place. As a number of owners in Montague wish to have their horses take part in Summerside races, but declined to send them if they were to be kept there over Sunday, Summerside Driving Park Co., arranged with the railway to run a special from and to Montague connecting at Rosaly, the Driving Park Company putting up the guarantee. It will thus be seen that the Railway authorities have not departed from the usual Dominion Day arrangements except where the guaranteed Montague special is concerned.
