AVIATOR HAMILTON TERRIBLY INJURED

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Feb. 19.-By leaping from his falling machine in mid-air to-day aviator Charles K. Hamilton probably saved his life, although he suffered internal injuries.

Hamilton was making a practice flight and had travelled about fifteen miles south of Pablo Beach when he turned and started back to the little seashore town. He had planned to return to town to fill his gasoline tank and make the flight to St. Augustine with the Port Green as his object.

The party hurriedly placed him in the automobile and dashed to Pablo for assistance. When reaching the latter place, signs of life were noted and telephone messages were sent to the city arranging for doctors to meet the party at the ferry.

Hamilton did not recover consciousness until he was placed aboard the ferry in South Jacksonville. As soon as he opened his eyes, he remarked to the attending physician:

"We must have had a spill!" He then relapsed into unconsciousness again. When he next opened his eyes he was in the operating room in the Desoto Hospital. His first remark was: "For heaven's sake, Doc, give me a cigarette."

Upon examination it was found that no bones were broken. He was badly shaken up, however, and may be fatally injured internally. His left leg is badly wrenched and he is covered with bruises.

A telegram reached the city for Mr. Hamilton after he was injured from his mother which read: "Be on lookout to come home; grandma very sick."

The message was sent from New Britain, Conn., the aviator's home. He was not notified of the illness of his relative because of his condition. If he recovers it will be several weeks before he is able to get out again.

THE NEW CHIEF RABBI OF EMPIRE.

ST. JOHN, Feb. 19.-Dr. Joseph H. Hertz, of New York, who was elected chief rabbi of the British Empire, at a meeting of the Electoral College in London last week, received 298 votes to thirty nine cast for Dr. Hyamson, head of the Jewish ecclesiastical court in London.

The New York candidate was the choice of the selection committee, and Lord Rothschild threatened to resign the presidency of the United Synagogue unless Doctor Hertz was elected.

Doctor Hertz has had a remarkable career. Born in Hungary, he entered the United States at an early age. He attended the public schools, proceeded to his degree of B. A. in Columbia University, and then entered the Hebrew Theological College, where he was prepared for the ministry. In due course, he went to South Africa, where his usual ability was instantly recognized by his own people and the general community.

He was elected chief rabbi for the whole of South Africa—a position in which he gave great satisfaction.

In the troubles which broke out between the English and Kruger, he sided with the former. For this he was exiled. He returned to the United States, but after the English won, he went back to South Africa. Some time ago he returned to the United States, where he enjoyed the respect and admiration of American Judaism. He is learned—cosmopolitan in his experience, yet true to the ancient faith.

Doctor Hertz is an able man, fully competent for his high position.

As to the position itself, it is something like the position of the Archbishop of Canterbury, as head of the English church. Dr. Hertz is the head of the Hebrew church in Great Britain. The Anglican church in Canada does not recognize the authority of the Archbishop of Canterbury, though it respects his office. Similarly, the Hebrew church in Canada will not recognize the authority of Dr. Hertz, but it will respect and look up to him. In England itself the authority of Dr. Hertz is supreme.
