NEWS OF THE HORSES FROM ALL SOURCES

J. A. McLEOD, Orwell, has sold a flag at the half, when Simmasse was leading by a length, Czarina pulled up at the half, but Simmasse drew away and won in an easy drive. Boutillier pulled up at the finish but could not save Winfield, and he finished outside the flag. The Amherst horse did not appear to be in the best of shape. He moves in something the same style as Phoebon W. and resembles that great track horse somewhat in appearance. He gave evidence of speed at times and will probably be heard from before the circuit closes.

Simmasse is travelling in great form and never lags here now during the races, and appears to have been entirely broken of the bad habit of breaking which stood her in such bad stead on many occasions on last year's circuit. The best time made in the free-for-all was 2:16 1/2 made in the first heat.

The other events were not especially well contested. Ruth Wilkes, owned by A. W. Learment, of Truro, had little difficulty in walking away with the 221 event, and Victor, entered by Charles Henry, of Chatham, won the 235 class in straight heats. There was some fairly good racing at times in the 221 event, especially the second heat, when Kremella and Delle Estelle put up a good fight for second.

A peculiar fact is that Springhill stables, although they had four entries in three events, succeeded in getting only one second, captured by Czarina in the free-for-all. Claudia Hal, entered from the Springhill stables in the 221 class, was drawn, and another entry from the same stables, Lady Bingen, in the free-for-all, was distanced in the first heat, and Fleetwood, from the Springhill stables, was distanced in the 235. Regal Pandol from these stables was drawn in the 225, and F. Duncanson's horses, Beta Mac and Burling, were drawn in the free-for-all and 235, respectively.
