The Reunion of 8th Siege Battery

Last evening the Davies' reel was the scene of a very pleasant event, about twenty-five members of the 8th Siege Battery assembled for an enjoyable Reunion. After doing justice to the good things provided in Mrs. Davies' usual good style Col. A. G. Peake, officer commanding the Eighth Battery until severely wounded at Armentiers in 1918, occupied the chair last night and read the following telegram from original members now in the west who conveyed their heartfelt felicitations, regretting their inability to be present with the other members of the good Old Eighth and signed by Chris Jenkins, Arthur Jenkins, David Miller, M. M., Arthur McKinnon and Rex Lea. A letter was also read from Lieut. A. E. B. Murphy, M. C., regretting he could not be present, owing to a severe attack of La Grippe.

Both telegram and letter, received much applause, and to show the spirit always existing in the Eighth, the song "For they are Jolly Good Fellows" was given with much enthusiasm.

The following toast was then given and responded to in admirable style, each speaker doing full justice to his subject, especially that of Bomb. Frank J. McDonald, who in eloquent terms replied to the toast "Our Departed Comrades", as follows—

...man of us, who does not hold a righteous fear, and a just respect for this inevitable end.

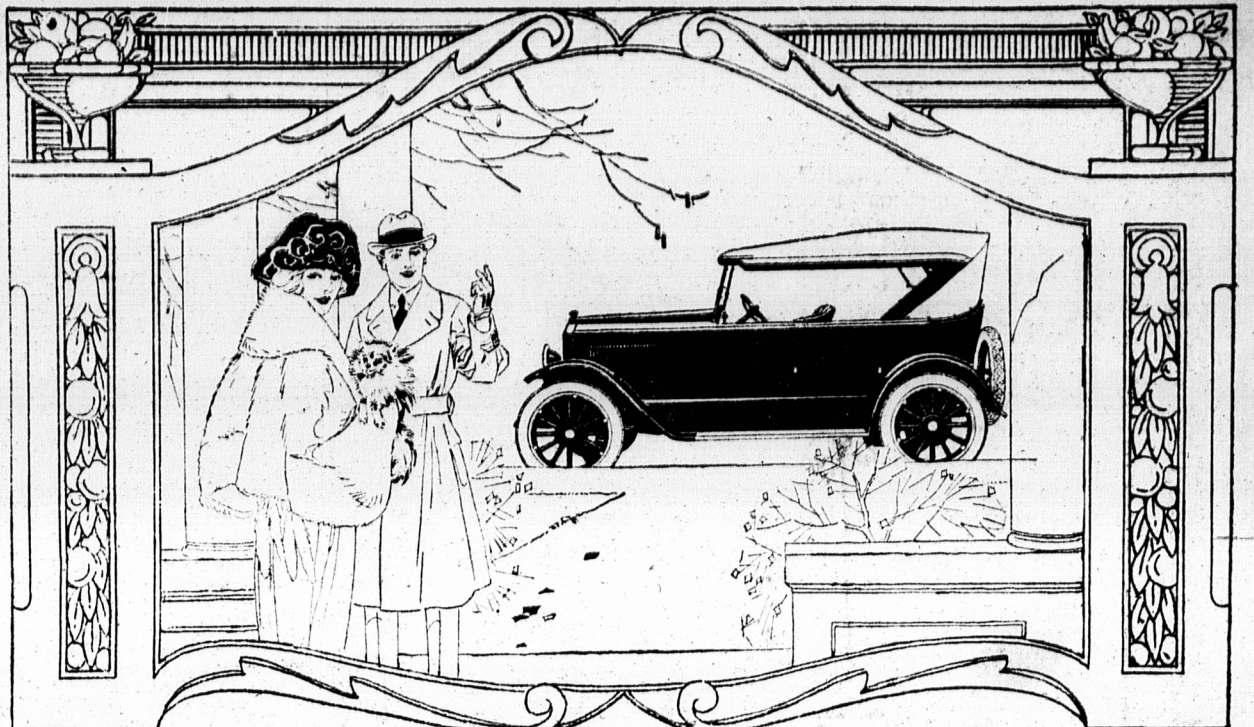

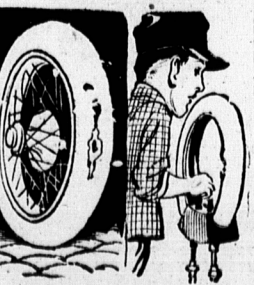
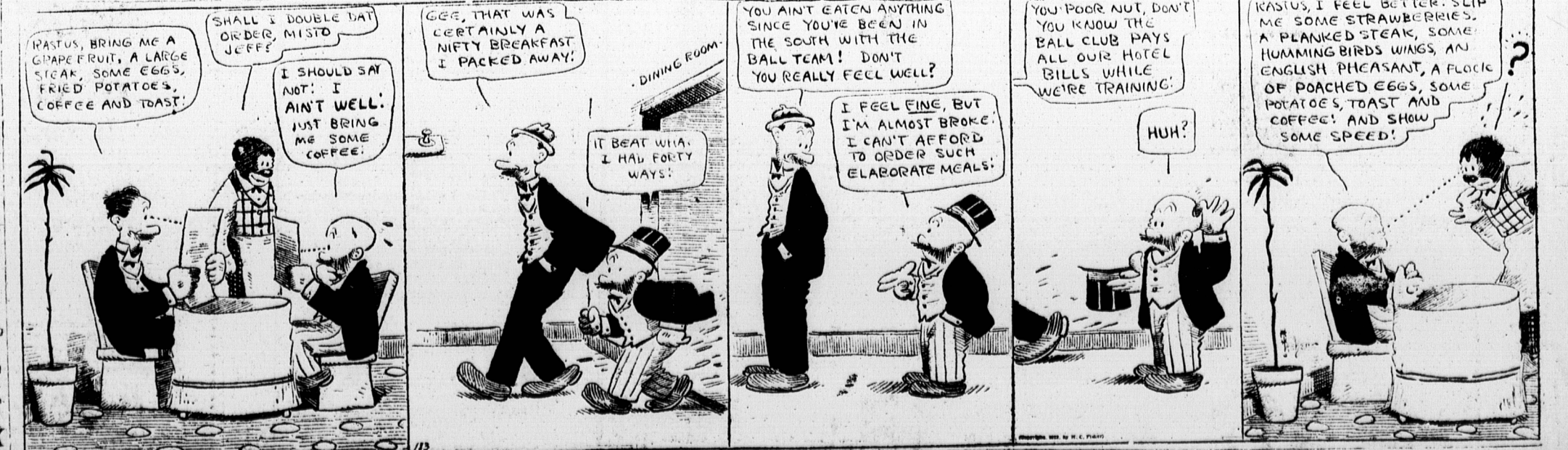
