### WOMAN CHEMIST MAKES RUBBER

FOULDER, Col., Sept. 16—After startling success in the production of "synthetic marble," Mrs. Jean Anderson, of this city, is developing "synthetic rubber" and "synthetic leather."

Both projects, says this woman, who came here three years ago, after teaching chemistry for 32 years at Columbus, O., are in defiance of the old law of chemistry that there can be no composition of chemicals and minerals.

Her newest work literally is glorifying the hollyhock, combined with different chemicals, that forms Mrs. Anderson's new experimental products.

She started work in November on "synthetic rubber." She sent a sample piece to a portable typewriter company, which replied that the material is valuable, if produced cheaply in quantities. Mrs. Anderson says it can.

A sample also was sent to Henry Ford, who called it "teak wood." The automobile magnate told Mrs. Anderson his chemists were doing similar work with soy beans.

A year ago she obtained a patent for her process of controlling chemicals.

By adding the juice of the hollyhock she has been able to obtain a flexible rubber.

### 700 EMPLOYED MEN REFUSE RELIEF SCHEME

(Canadian Press)

LONG BRANCH, Ont., Sept. 15—Seven hundred men employed by Dominion Government under relief scheme are on strike here today. The camp is made of single unemployed men who are housed and fed and receive 20 cents a day for erecting barracks and rifle ranges.

Discussion broke out when the carpenters refused to make wooden forms for concrete at the 20 cent a day wage extending they were qualified tradesmen and entitled to union wages.

Today the men demanded of the superintendent that tradesmen be paid the prevailing rate and unemployed workers 35 cents an hour. They refused to return to work while the superintendent took the matter to the authorities.

OTTAWA, Sept. 15—The Department of National Defence had received only the barest details late today of the trouble at Long Branch, Ont., where it was reported 700 men in a Construction Camp there had refused to work for twenty cents a day. The camp is under the direction of a civilian administrator acting for the Department, and under the immediate supervision of the officer commanding Military District No. 2, in Toronto.

"It is hardly proper to call it a strike," an officer of the Department here stated. "Our information is that the men refused to go on with the work under the conditions laid down in all these camps. The camps were established, it was stated, for the purpose of providing a means of caring for single unemployed men whose essential needs are supplied and who receive an allowance of 20 cents a day.

Representatives of the men and the company agreed to accept a compromise proposal which promised amicable settlement of the dispute. The strike order has been withdrawn and the men will take a ballot on the proposed 15 percent wage reduction. One of the contentions of the company officials was that the employees had no opportunity to express their wishes through a secret ballot.
