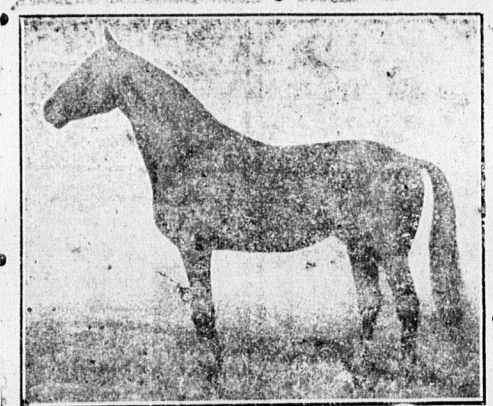

**THE PRINCE COUNTY GUARDIAN**

Offices in Summerside, J. Frank Lafferty, Manager, and in Alberton, Herbert Clark, Manager

—The latest news, first of all.

—The steamer John Irwin, with a cargo of coal for the Railway, arrived in Summerside yesterday afternoon.

—Rev. D. J. Fraser of the Presbyterian College, Montreal and formerly of Alberton, was visiting in St. John last week.

—Among the passengers from Summerside yesterday were Colin Craswell to Pt. du Chene and Capt. F. Peters to Moncton.

—The schooner Malabar sailed Sunday for Point du Chene, taking 2000 bags potatoes loaded for Jos. Read & Co., Summerside.

—The funeral of the late Levi Perry, Kensington, will take place today (Tuesday the eleventh) from the residence of the Misses Webster to the Margate Cemetery. The funeral will be directed by Mt. Zion Lodge A. F. & A. M.

—The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council, was held in the Council Chamber last night, the Mayor and all the Councilors present. Bills to the amount of \$1940.90 were read and ordered paid. The assessors report showed the value of real estate in Summerside as \$1,750,505, a total of \$1,410,688 an increase of \$135,635, over last year. The number of persons liable for poll-tax 644. Councillor McLellan, Chairman of the Finance Committee, presented the estimate of revenue and expenditure for the year. The estimated revenue for 1909 is placed at 25,254.88. The rate of assessment for school and civic purposes, was placed at \$8 per 1000 and the poll tax at \$3. A special tax of \$2 per 1000 on the assessment and 25 cents on the poll-tax was made for water and sewerage purposes. The special tax on incorporated companies doing business in Summerside, was placed as follows: Banks \$150 or if on premises owned by them \$125. Life insurance companies \$25; Fire insurance companies \$15; Accident insurance companies, \$15; Plate Glass companies, \$10; Marine insurance companies, \$10; Express companies \$15. A tax of \$25 on all other incorporated companies except steamboats, whose head office is not in Summerside was made. A special tax was also levied on the following: Rinks \$20, Retail Ice dealers 10c, Junk dealers \$10. Persons engaged in hauling sand or stone, not licensed truckmen, \$4. Persons engaged in Muscad mud digging \$2. On delivery wagons \$3. Delivery carts or slovens \$4. Non-resident vegetable dealers \$3. Non-resident butchers selling or delivering meat in Summerside \$15. Non-resident fish dealers \$2. Persons using driving horses as such, \$2 per horse. The clerk was instructed to inquire of the City Clerk of Montreal as to the cost of laying asphalt sidewalks on their residential streets. Councillor Brace moved that the citizens be asked to observe Friday the 21st of May as Arbor Day in order to help beautify the town. Councillor Brace moved that 10 cars of stone be purchased for use on the streets. A by-law was passed ordering that every house in which contagious diseases, especially consumption, has been found shall be fumigated and cleaned within ten days after death or removal, and that no person or family shall move into any such house unless a certificate shall be presented under a penalty of \$30 for each offence. A by-law was also passed ordering that all milk vendors doing business in the town shall file with the town clerk a certificate signed by a veterinary of a test of all cows from which the milk, which they offer for sale is procured.

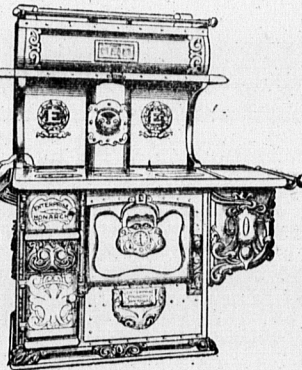
