## EUROPEAN NEWS

VIENNA, Feb. 6 (Special)—Prince Sixtus of Bourbon-Parma, brother of the Archduchess Zita, delivered an address before a brilliant company in the rooms of the Geographical Society upon a journey of exploration undertaken between Palmyra and the Lower Euphrates. Prince Sixtus was accompanied by Dr. Musil, the well-known explorer and Professor of Starting with a small caravan of ten Camels from Palmyra the explorers visited first the region of Nedjed and Kerbela. Proceeding then across the Euphrates to the ruins of Babylon and to Baghdad they began to explore Southern Mesopotamia between the Euphrates, the Tigris, and the thirty-sixth degree of north latitude.

After visiting "Tekrit on the Tigris westward and passed the Euphrates again at Rakka. Here the expedition narrowly escaped destruction at the hands of the Shammar Bedouins, and lost some of its photographs and scientific booty. Enough was saved to render possible the mapping of Southern Mesopotamia and of the Euphrates from Meskene to Kuta.

The town of Resafa was studied in detail, accurate drawings being made of the massive wall, a work of the sixth century, and of the Church of St. Sergius, built before the year 481. The complete results of the expedition with the maps will be published by Prince Sixtus of Parma and Professor Musil a few months hence.

VIENNA, Feb. 4 (Special)—An extraordinary tragedy which occurred at Trieste is attracting wide attention on the part of medical scientists in one in which a mother during sleep murdered her infant child with a razor. The woman, who had been almost demented since the terrible occurrence, is at present being held at the disposal of the judicial authorities until the medical experts shall have been able to give an opinion of the affair.

The woman is the wife of a Corfote named Bellelli, and when, after six years of married life, a child was born to the couple in September last their dearest wish was realized. Father and mother appeared to have worshipped the little one. On the night of Sunday the woman, speaking in her sleep, said to her husband "The child is ill." The man, although aware that his wife was not awake, got out of bed and looked at the baby.

The infant was lying quietly and no fear was aroused in his mind but he called his sister-in-law and told her what had happened. As soon as she took the child in her arms she saw that it was dead. The mother was

He went on to complain of the desecration of many of his parishioners, who he alleged, said things behind his back which they dared not say to his face and he concluded with the remark that many members of the congregation present at that service only attended church once a year. Strong indignation is felt by the parishioners.

BERLIN, Feb. 5 (Special)—The Kaiser has consented to have a new likeness of himself made for the Prussian coinage. This will be the first change made during his reign. The face which has appeared on the Prussian coins for the last twenty-five years shows the Kaiser as he was when he ascended the throne, with the sharply upturned mustache which he made famous. He had now approved of a likeness which reveals him at middle life, but the style will be kept secret until the appearance of the new coins after his Majesty's silver jubilee in June.

BERLIN, Feb. 4 (Special)—The German Navy, according to a statement published here, is shortly to possess a revolving disappearing airship shed on the island of Heligoland, North Sea.

The airship shed will be built in a deep depression now used as a garden for the officers of the garrison. The depression, which is 130 yards long, is to be lengthened to 200 yards. Except when an airship is entering or leaving it the shed will rest on the bottom of the hollow, its roof filling in the space between the sides, so that it will scarcely be visible to hostile airmen and will be entirely unrecognizable by warships. The shed will be raised after the manner of a gasometer. It will be constructed so that it will resolve in order that an airship may enter with the wind blowing in any direction.

Heligoland is barely 350 miles from the mouth of the Thames—about a seven hours flight in the weather—for the German naval Zeppelin.
