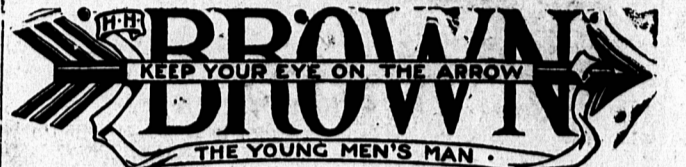

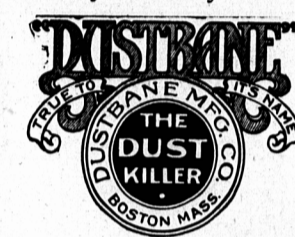

Sprinkle where you are to begin (not all over the carpet) then sweep as you always do.
