His Excellency the Governor-General has paid due respect to the Maritimes in his tour, and the smaller provinces are probably a little more sensitive than the larger ones.

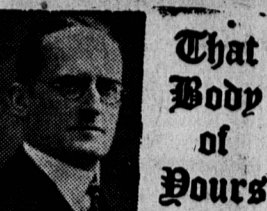
Statistics of motor cars give the United States 22,137,334 automobiles. That is the equivalent of one car for every five inhabitants of the Republic.

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PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND AS A TOURIST RESORT

Some Interesting and Delightful Locations Described For "Guardian Readers."

STANHOPE (By HAROLD MESSERVY)

Stanhope, one of the oldest and best-known of the north shore summer resorts, lies eighteen miles from Charlottetown, if one goes direct, that is, by the Covehead road.

It is a very lovely drive from Stanhope, Point to Stanhope, and at many points in the road, one comes to a delightful glimpse of Covehead Bay, seen for it may be only an instant, through a gap in the trees by the road side.

Inside on its walls, are tablets placed in memory of its earliest ministers. The first of these was the Rev. Peter Gordon, who was minister (about the year 1800) of Covehead, St. Peter's and Bay Fortune.

Not far from here, too, in Covehead, resided the Rev. Theophilus DesBrisay, first Rector of St. Paul's English Church, Charlottetown—or, to be more exact, the first rector who saw his parish, since the previous incumbent the Rev. John Caulfield, never left England.

Here, of course, as elsewhere on the North Shore, there is an excellent beach for bathing. As usual, too, it is cut off from the land by a rampart of sand dunes, which at this point are fairly low.

HOUSEHOLD SCRAP BOOK By ROBERTA LEE

Wall Paper Paste Dissolve 10c worth of glue by soaking for 24 hours in cold water. Boil 4 gallons of water; then stir in a quart of flour which has been mixed into a smooth paste with cold water.

Rust on Steel To remove rust from steel, cover the spot with sweet oil, rub well and allow it to remain a few days. Then rub with powdered unslacked lime until the spot is gone.

Acceptable for Broken Needles Keep a can or box with close fitting lid for holding broken needles, discarded razors and blades and broken glass. It will avoid accidents.
