Poultry Exports To U. S. Aids Industry

OTTAWA, Aug. 5.—(CP)—Agriculture Department officials said today that applications for permits to export 4,300,000 pounds of live and dressed poultry to the United States had been received. The applications were received since last week when the United Kingdom's ban on poultry imports from Canada brought a lifting of the 1944 ban against Canadian exports to the United States.
