## Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.  
1. Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years.  
2. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.  
3. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties: Six months residence in each of three years after certifying homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.  
4. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties: Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

## CONDITIONS SPLENDID IN PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

OTTAWA, Dec. 15.—"Never in the history of the Canadian Government Railways has the Prince Edward Island branch of that system of about 400 miles, done such a splendid business as it has done during the past year," said Mr. P. A. Smith, of Charlottetown, P. E. I., to The Journal today.  
He is representing Lodge No. 413, Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen, at the convention of the Legislative Board which opened its session in the Albert St. hall yesterday.  
"Things are booming there," he continued, "and conditions and prospects are good."  
The Legislative Board had a private session in the Albert street hall this morning and will continue to hold them for the balance of the week. Both the secretary and chairman stated this morning that there was nothing to be given out to press.

## GERMANY'S BIG REQUISITIONS OF BELGIUM'S FOOD.

"Population will surely die of starvation without outside help," declares leading Amsterdam paper.  
MONTREAL, December 15.—"The population of Belgium will surely die of starvation, if the people of outside countries do not regularly send them the necessities of life." This is the announcement made in a remarkable article in the "Vrij Belgie," of Amsterdam, a copy of which has just been received here.

The article contains some remarkable figures as to the extent of Germany's requisitions of food in Belgium. These figures, which come direct from Karl Ballod, the German statistician, are verified for as correct. They show that the amount of food supplies already taken by the Germans from Belgium and the North of France are:—438,000 tons of meat, 537,000 tons of potatoes, 673,000 tons of bread, and 55,000 tons of butter. These, according to Professor Ballod,

have constituted 4 per cent. of the total consumption of meat in Germany and 6 per cent of this total consumption of bread. In addition to all this, Professor Ballod declares that Germany requisitioned in Belgium, soon after the beginning of the war, 400,000 tons of flour and at least 1,000,000 people will surely die of starvation "And now," says the paper, "the unless outside supplies of food are sent in regularly."  
Through the Belgian Relief Committee, Canadians have contributed nobly to the relief of these unfortunate people. But that help must be continued. The needs are greater than ever, and it is believed that few Canadians, once they realise this, will hesitate to contribute to the funds being raised. Subscriptions large or small are being invited more earnestly than ever. 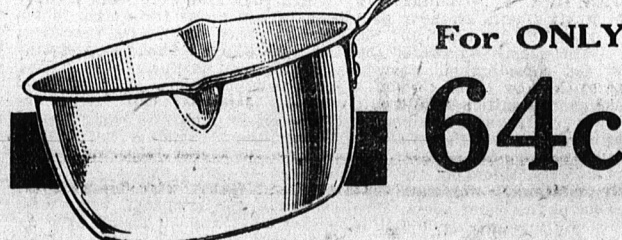
