WOOD FUEL SCARCIE In many parts of this country wood fuel is very scarce. At High Bank and Guernsey Cove they have to go some eleven miles to get hard wood, and five to six miles for spruce wood. At East Point, east of Elmira, there is no hardwood and no spruce, all fir. But west of Elmira, in the Turentam, there is plenty of good hardwood. Good, old hardwood land is worth much more than the best cleared and worked land, worth up to \$100 an acre in some localities.

EASTERN NEWS—The fall fishing at Basin Head was very successful while it lasted, but owing to the windy weather the fishermen were obliged to land their trawls Friday the 15th. Mr. Harold Stewart of Kingsboro, has sold a valuable piece of woodland to Mr. Willard Ching of Basin Head for a snug sum. 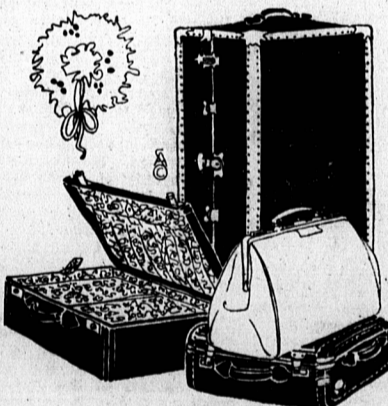

To Be Broken Up Bones Of A Patagonia Dinosaur Discovered

LONDON, Dec. 19—The battleship Hibernia, sold for breaking up abroad, has left Sheerness in tow of German tugs for Germany. The Hibernia was constructed at Devonport, and cost over a million sterling. In the course of her career she has served as flagship in the Atlantic, Channel, the Home Fleet, and the Third Battle Squadron, and is one of the eight battleships of the King Edward VII. class, of which two were lost in the war. The Hibernia was first commissioned on Jan. 2, 1907.

BUENOS AIRES, Dec. 20—Discovery of the thigh bones of a Patagonia dinosaur, each bone measuring two metres, 70 centimetres (nearly nine feet) in length, and claiming to be the largest unearthed in any part of the world, was announced today by La Plata Museum.

These two bones, together with other fossil remains of the gigantic animal, were found by the museum's paleontological experts at Neuquon on Nov. 20.
