The Eighth Annual Provincial Convention will be held in the Presbyterian Church, Summerside, Tuesday and Wednesday, Oct. 15th and 16th, 1901. The first session opens at 10.30 Tuesday morning.

DELEGATES. Pastors of evangelical churches, superintendents of schools, and members of the Executive Committee are members ex-officio, of the Convention. Each school is entitled to send its superintendent and two delegates, whatever its membership is and one extra delegate, if the membership of the school is more than one hundred.

ENTERTAINMENT. Those attending the Convention will be entertained by the kindness of the citizens of Summerside, provided their names are forwarded to Mr. W. H. Brown, Summerside, previous to October 12th.

TRAVELING ARRANGEMENTS. All persons going to the Convention via P. E. I. Railway will purchase the usual single fare ticket to Summerside. At the Convention each delegate will be supplied with a certificate of attendance which when presented to the Railway agent of Summerside will procure a free ticket for return home, good to Oct. 18th.

PROGRAM. An excellent program is being prepared by the executive. Mr. Marlon Lawrence of Toledo, Ohio U. S. A., who has been for several years the general Secretary of the International S. S. Association will be present to give addresses and assist in the discussions. Diplomas will be presented to the Normal graduates, and an address to the graduating class will be given by Dr. Anderson, Superintendent of Education.
