THE BALLOT REJECTED.

We greatly regret that the provincial Government has deliberately refused to give the people the boon of the ballot in our elections. We regret it for the sake of the voters, and partly because this journal had recommended it. We regret it too because in so vital a matter of reform in our representative system it leaves this Province far in the rear of all other sections of Canada and in the rear of all other civilized countries.

In many other matters we are well abreast of the march of progress. In dealing with the liquor traffic we lead the whole Dominion, a banner Province which in that regard is admired and praised by the best citizenship of Canada from the Atlantic to the Pacific. In regard to the ballot we are not only far behind, but, under present leadership we have absolutely refused to follow. This is, we think, deeply regrettable. We regard it also as a tactical mistake for Premier Hazzard. He has undoubtedly given to his wily opponent and the militant minority across the floor a distinct advantage in the political game. The Premier would not willingly or knowingly give such an advantage to his opponents, but to make the ballot an issue between the two political parties with the Liberals opposing the free vote can have no other effect than that we have set down.

And the reasons put forward by the worthy Premier are not of the sort that will appeal to the community. He calls the open vote the British vote. The time was long ago when open voting was the British practice, but it has long ceased to be British, alike in the British Isles and in every Province of the vast British Empire. The time was when the British crossbow was a British weapon of war, but the rifle has taken its place. Premier Hazzard's reasoning extended would discard the rifle and restore the bow, declaring the latter to be the true British weapon.

The time was when leaders and chiefs were chosen for their prowess in fight, their strength and their big fists. The tribe of barbarians gathered in council and bellowed on his name. That was open voting. But when civilization came to Greece and Rome they adopted the ballot. Greece lost the ballot when she lost her liberties, but a century ago with liberty regained she resumed the ballot, and actually elected her first new Parliament with ball ballots or lead-bullets that had been cast for battle against the Turks.

As we have said all free countries have adopted the ballot. We have it in our federal elections. All other Provinces have it in their provincial elections as well. Both parties in Canada are agreed as to its merits. Ballot voting is the only free voting for the employee, the official, for the debtor, for the individual in any way subject to intimidation, the influence or the control of another. The ballot is the only British vote today. It is a strange misnomer to call the open vote British because Britain has long ago and finally rejected it.

MR. WARBURTON AND THE TUNNEL.

We note with pleasure an able letter from Mr. Warburton, K. C. in favor of the Tunnel, recently published in the Toronto Globe. In this letter Mr. Warburton asks The Globe's support in urging "the early construction of this work which is so vital to our welfare," and goes on to say: "It is useless to expect contentment till this is done or until we are shown that it is impracticable which we do not believe it to be."

Mr. Warburton does not believe that any steamer can be constructed which will keep up the connection

in conditions such as those of 1905-6. "No steamer they can build could enter or leave Pictou under like conditions," he says.

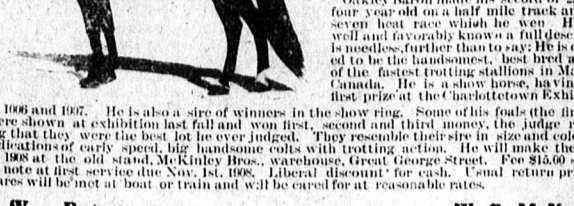
