SPAIN CHOOSES AMBASSADOR

MADRID, Nov. 5.—(Special).—Much interest attaches to the naming of the Spanish Legation at Washington to the Embassy rank, and it is stated that Senor Don Gonzalez Honoria, recently Under Secretary of State, will be proposed for the post of Ambassador. The present Minister of the United States is Senor Don Juan Rianoy Gayangos.

SENDING CHRISTMAS PACKAGES

When you have Christmas packages that are to travel a long distance, sew them up in strong unbleached muslin over the wrapping paper, writing the address on a tag. You can then be sure that they will arrive in perfect condition.

Jam that has become hard and sugary can be made almost as good as when fresh by placing in the oven until the sugar melts, then taking it out and leaving it to cool.

If you scorch an article while ironing, take a towel, preferable Turkish, moisten and lay the scorched part between two folds of the damp towel. Then place a hot iron directly over the scorched place, and if the stain does not disappear in a few seconds try another application.

Woolen ratine and velvet are combined in children's coats in different ways. One coat of rich brown velvet, shows a belt and collars and cuffs of black ratine. White ratine is used now for little boys' Russian blouse suits. There is a great deal of warmth in this material, and ratine suits can be worn in the house all winter.

BULGARIA SEEKS A NEW DESTINY

PARIS, Nov. 5.—(Special).—The Bulgarian Minister of Foreign Affairs, M. Ghenaleff, who is visiting in Paris for the purpose of securing a loan of 400,000,000 francs for his Government, takes a philosophic view of his country's present situation.

In an interview in Le Matin yesterday morning M. Ghenaleff said: "The second Balkan war, which is laid to our account, was liberally planned against us at the time we were fighting the Turks. Our allies counted on exhausting us and then turning the whole world against us. We were robbed of the fruits of our victories, our honor was assailed and we were represented as barbarians; nevertheless our victories can never be effaced from history but will constitute a moral. In speaking of the first war the Turks always describe it as the Turco-Bulgarian campaign, regarding ours as the only army that counted."

The Minister added that the Bulgarians in unanimity, rapidity of mobilization and action, and in endurance, had given the world a great example, greater in their defeat than in victory. Their great feat of transporting 400,000 men with rapidity had never been equalled. They had been assailed by Serbia, Greece, Montenegro, Roumania and Turkey, yet had fought to the last ditch and finally suspended hostilities after they had achieved a great victory.

"A nation which has triumphed over such trials," he remarked, "cannot be overcome by one reverse or by loss of territory. We will recommence the work which has progressed during the thirty years of our independent existence, carrying the fight into another territory. We have decided to cultivate that material and intellectual development which will take place us at the head of the Balkan nations, with the unshaken conviction that we can accomplish this in a few years."

TEN YEARS OF PANAMA REPUBLIC.

PANAMA, Nov. 3.—The Republic of Panama to-day began celebrations in honor of the tenth anniversary of its independence from Colombia. With the water already turned into Culabra Cut and the final completion of the great canal in sight, the celebration will be carried through the entire week and is expected to be more brilliant than in any previous year. To-day was observed as a public holiday by all classes. Crowds of Americans joined in the festivities with as much enthusiasm as was displayed by the native residents of the republic.

BANK OF MONTREAL HAS NEW PRESIDENT.

MONTREAL, Nov. 3.—Changes in the ranks of the officers of the Bank of Montreal were officially announced this afternoon. H. V. Meredith, Vice-President and Chief executive officer, R. B. Angus, the President, Montreal, retires from that position at his own request, but remains a member of the Board of Directors. Sir Frederick Williams Taylor, Manager at London, is appointed to the position of General Manager and will assume his new duties here when his successor in London is appointed. A. D. Braithwaite, Superintendent of Ontario branches, Toronto, has been given the office of Assistant General Manager.
