FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE.

The recent outbreak of the foot and mouth disease in Massachusetts has already caused great loss to the herds of that and adjoining States and has involved very serious disturbances of the cattle trade and of transportation and shipping business throughout the New England States and Canada. It has tended for the time to increase cattle transportation by the Intercolonial with shipments from St. John and Halifax to European markets, but this temporary gain is more than offset by the danger of having a much-dreaded, infectious disease so near at hand. Down to December 27, 1300 head of cattle in Massachusetts had been slaughtered to check its spread and many more have since suffered as a precautionary measure, involving a loss of over \$50,000.

Foot and mouth disease has been known for a very long time. It was well described by some observers in the middle of the eighteenth century when it broke out with great violence, especially in Germany and France. It raged from 1800 to 1812, and from 1819 to 1823 particularly in Southern Germany, Switzerland and Italy. In 1839 it was introduced into England, where, since then, ten great outbreaks have taken place. In 1845-1846, and in 1855-1857, it spread over the whole of Europe.

During 1871, 700,000 head of cattle, both in England and in France, became infected. During 1883 in Great Britain, the disease attacked nearly half a million head, in Prussia, Austria, and Italy 60,000 in each country. In the German Empire during 1890, over 800,000 animals became infected, and during 1892 over 4,000,000, (in Prussia alone over 3,000,000).

Foot and mouth disease is of great importance from the stockman's point of view, for the pecuniary loss is generally very severe, in consequence of the rapid manner in which this disease spreads through the entire stock of a country. From 25 to 50 per cent. of all the cattle may become infected. Traffic and commerce suffer great restrictions in consequence of the legal enactments that are put into force. The loss in milk and its products is heavy. Some times the mortality of the infected animals is comparatively high.

The losses thus caused in England in 1883 were estimated at one million sterling; in France in 1871 at £1,500,000.

while the losses in Germany during the last outbreak were reckoned at five millions sterling. These figures sufficiently show why stringent precautions are now being taken in Great Britain and Canada to prevent the possible spread of the disease across their borders.

Prosecutor Campbell, Marshal Cameron and his assistants of the force deserve hearty commendation for the prompt effective manner in which they carried out the seizure and arrest on Queen Street on Tuesday last. The incident also illustrates the importance of one of the amendments to the Prohibition Law enacted at the last session of the Legislature.

Let returns from the Ontario referendum, now nearly complete, show 199,077 votes for the Prohibition Act and 104,051 against, giving a majority of 96,026 for the Act. East Nipissing is yet to hear from. The Dominion Alliance will ask the Government for legislation closing all the bar-rooms and to abolish the sale of liquor in club-houses.

From time to time paragraphs have gone the rounds of the press representing that a serious quarrel existed between the King of Spain and the Queen Mother, amounting to a scandal. Mr. Stories, the United States Ambassador to Austria-Hungary, and formerly representative at Madrid has denounced the calumniators of the Spanish court. He says:

"A most emphatic contradiction should be given to the boulevard slanders against the King and the Queen Mother. Only two days ago, when I saw the young King, I was struck by the fact that he had grown fully half a head since I saw him last July. He had also broadened out until he was full chested and erect and he was the picture of manly health. His face reflected his happy disposition, and there were no traces of his being weighed down by the cares of State. The King's tender devotion to the Queen Mother showed in their beautiful family life and the close sympathy of the members of the royal family. The report of the intended marriage of the Queen Mother was an equally audacious slander."

The Guardian having given publication to one of the reports referred to cheerfully publishes the above authoritative contradiction. We venture the hope that his Catholic Majesty and the Queen Mother, the embodiment of many queenly virtues, may enjoy a happy and prosperous new year.
