Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy or by mail is not permitted. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

QUESTIONS OF GREAT IMPORTANCE

LONDON, June 20.—Matters of great importance await the consideration of parliament which reassembles to-day. Since recess was taken three weeks ago there have been three happenings of great moment, namely, the naval battle off Jutland, the allies economic conference at Paris and the death of Lord Kitchener, which necessitates the appointment of a new war minister.

The legislature will want much information concerning these matters, and in addition the attitude of the Allies toward Greece and the Irish problem provide questions for deep consideration.

Much attention will also be given to finance as the new budget is promised for next month and another vote of credit is scheduled for early in August. There remains besides the problem of the extension of life of the parliament.

It is reported that there is a division among the members of the cabinet over the proposals for the settlement of the Irish question, which
