CZAR OF RUSSIA LOSES HIS SUIT

Against Russian Subject Who was Living in Canada --Defendant Skipped

WINNIPEG, March 31.—Court on Saturday morning dismissed the famous action of the Ozar of Russia against Ludkopy, former treasurer of the Transcanadian railway, who was sued by his imperial majesty for a shortage of \$200,000 in his account. Ludkopy was here some time with a female companion and invested heavily in Winnipeg real estate. He was about to open a store here when warned of the action. He skipped out and is now supposed to be on the American Pacific coast. The court decided it had no jurisdiction.

RUSSIAN PLAN FOR BALKANS

Proposal Counter to That of England - Austria is Conciliatory.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 31.—Austria's reply to the Russian note is extremely conciliatory. In substance the Russian note states that the British project of reform in Macedonia is deserving of sympathy, but that the principal measures proposed are sure to meet with unsurmountable obstacles, chiefly with respect to the nomination of a Christian governor for Macedonia, and the reduction of troops, with a rider guaranteeing the territorial integrity of Turkey. In her counter project Russia proposes to extend the functions of the international financial commission at Salonica over the police and courts of Macedonia, at the same time enlarging the powers of the general inspector. It is further suggested that the commission shall consist of representatives of the six great powers, equal in standing, the commissioners in the defence to Turkey's wish, to be enrolled in the Turkish state service. A minor provision seeks to create rural guards from the peasantry.
