THOMAS MORRISON.

Mr. and Mrs. John J. Morrison of Georgetown Royalty have received the sad news of the death of their son Thomas, who passed away in Buena Ventura, Columbia, South America, on October 28 after an illness from yellow fever. The deceased was twenty five years of age. He left home eight years ago, and located in Prince Rupert, B. C., being one of the pioneers of that city. Three years later he removed to Vancouver and remained in and around that city till last year, when he and some of his friends left on a mining venture to Southern Chili. They put into Buena Ventura for repairs, and while there some of the crew contracted yellow fever which resulted in the deaths of several of them, including Thomas Morrison. The deceased was well known in athletic circles around the Pacific northwest, and represented the Vancouver Athletic Club in various meets for several years. Besides his parents he leaves to mourn the following brothers and sisters: Malachi in Morin Wyoming, Felix in Little Pond, P. E. I., George in Phipps River, Margaret and Sarah in Boston, and John D. Andrew and Mary at home. The parents and other relatives will have the deep sympathy of a wide circle of friends in their sore bereavement.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (that Sub-Agency) on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in a city.
