NEW TRUST COMPANY.—It will be of interest to state that the petition presented to the Legislature last week for an act to incorporate a new trust company, a local concern, to do business in this province under the style of the "Prince Edward Island Trust Company," was largely and influentially signed, the signatories being Messrs. Frank R. Heartz, James Paton, Benjamin Rogers, Chas. H. Chandler, L. E. Prowse, J. P. Gordon, R. C. A. Grant, Alexander Horne, R. H. Jenkins, John McKenna, R. H. Sterns, D. O'M. Reddin, D. J. Riley, W. A. Weeks, Walter Mathieson, E. Ings, John Newsom, Bruce Stewart and Dr. P. Conroy, of Charlottetown; B. I. Raynor, of Alberton; William Stewart, C. McArthur, John H. Bell, D. W. Tanton, John S. Hinton, A. R. Brennan and Albert C. Sanders, of Summerside, and Roy C. McLean, of Souris. As previously stated, the company propose to begin with a capital of \$500,000, divided into five thousand shares of \$100 each.

EGMONT BAY.—A large meeting of the Egmont Bay parishioners took place in St. Philip's hall on March 23rd. The chief topic of discussion was the upholding of the cheese factory or installing a better plant. The directors of the cheese factory had previously been authorized, to look for information as regards the cost of a better plant, or whether it would be advisable to take such a step or whether a pasteurized would be beneficial to the cheese factory. Among the informations obtained communications from outside parties who are good authorities in the dairy business. These were of the opinion that the cheese factory should be kept up. After some discussion it was unanimously decided to procure a pasteurizer. Many able speeches in support of the cheese factory were made, and on the whole its outlook is very promising. The question of paying by the test, was also discussed but no decision arrived at. No doubt this pasteurized which it is proposed to buy will be a very useful thing as its purpose it is understood is to preserve the whey render it more palatable and nourishing.
