Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, or certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section also. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after entry. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years. A homesteader may erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Livestock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

ON THE FIRING LINE

The following letter has been received by Mrs. Samuel Sherren of Crapaud from her son Kilburn, now on the firing line in France:
Somewhere in France,
Feb. 10th, 1916.

Dear Mother— I received your very welcome letter this morning and was very glad to hear from you. I am feeling fine and hope this letter finds you all the same.

We just came out of the trenches last night and are safe in our tents for a few days. It is a little damp in our tent but the boys put on a good fire and altogether its pretty comfortable. We are having fine weather here now. It rained a little this morning but is fine again. I was, to see the boys from home they are all well at the present time.

Well mother we were six days in the trenches and I guess it would make you nervous if you could see how close some of the shells fell around us but luckily they did not explode.

Our trenches are real dry and not at all too bad a place for we mean to fight the Huns to a finish if God spars us. I will have to ring off for this time. I could write you a very long letter of the fine people I have met since I came over here but if I ever return I will tell it all to you in words. Give my love to father and children not forgetting your share. Write soon. Your loving son,

SOCIAL EVENING

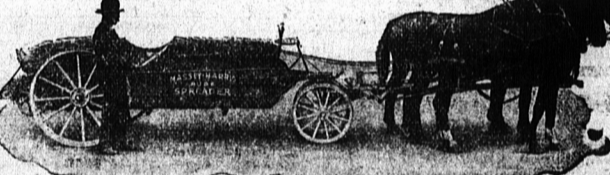

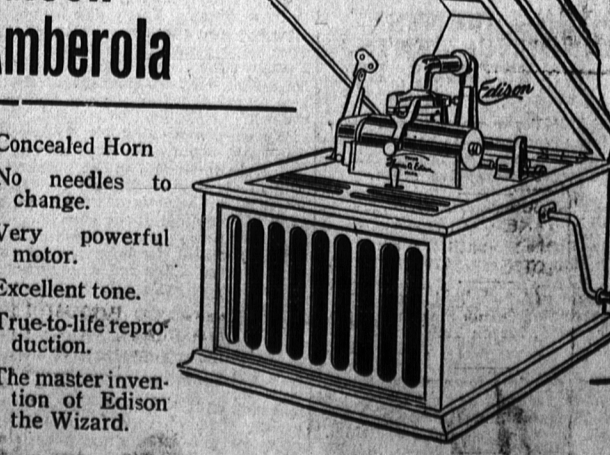
