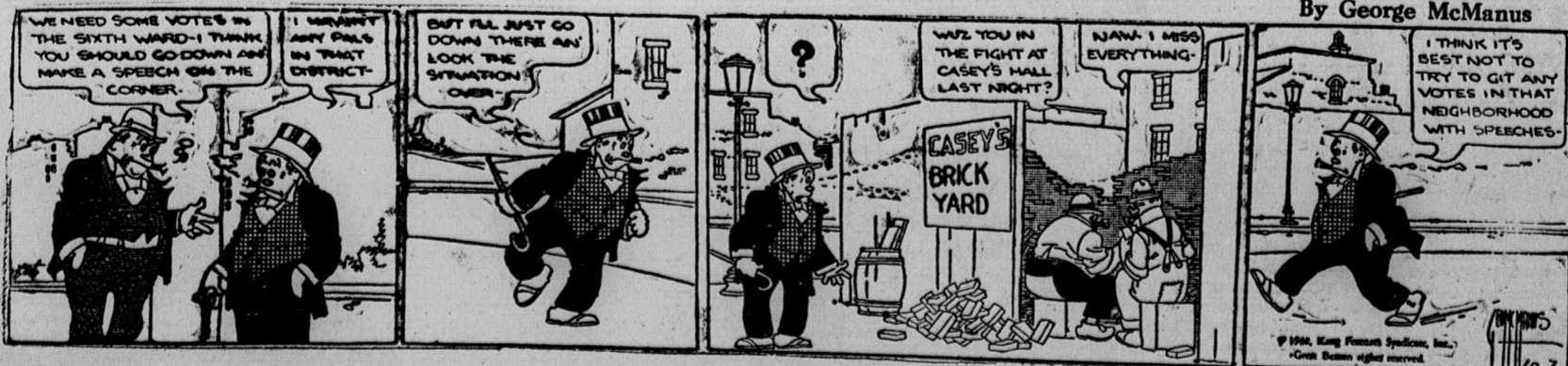

CURIOSITY MAY PAY

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Oct. 6.—Curiosity, says C. H. Hayes, Portland mineralogist, may bring a fortune for Mrs. Blanche Trigg of Santa Fe.
The basis of the prospective wealth is an abandoned gold mine, possibly of Spanish origin. Old slag from an unascertained source aroused her curiosity. Mrs. Trigg found the slag several weeks ago while walking along the Rio Percho River near Hillsboro. As there apparently was no smelter thereabouts, she asked Hayes to make a survey.
Hayes reported today he found the mine on Government land, with evidence that Spaniards had worked with baskets. He said Mrs. Trigg had filed a claim and hired four miners and that the ore assayed \$664 in gold, \$5.71 in silver and \$1 in lead to the ton.
