Fox ranchers and those interested in the industry will be interested in the following from a St. John exchange:—Among the shipments aboard the steamer Admiral Sampson from Alaska to Seattle last week was a consignment of six live silver tip foxes, in charge of F. G. Whelpley, who plans to establish a farm for breeding the animals on the Bay of Fundy, Nova Scotia. The foxes are from the interior of Alaska, near Fairbanks, and are the first shipment of 200 ordered by the Canadian government for breeding purposes. The foxes will be used in replenishing the forests of Canada, where the animals are rapidly being exterminated.
