The many followers and friends of Fred Cameron, Amherst, the well known distance runner will read the following with interest.—That Fred Cameron, Hans Holmer and Tom Longboat will take part in the Powder Hill marathon at Edinburgh is the statement in the Halifax Herald today. Holmer won the race last year, running as an American. Of this the Herald says:—Homer ran last year with the Stars and Stripes wrapped around him. Fred Cameron is a Canadian through and through and said to the writer: "If I compete in the Powder Hill event, the Union Jack will be good enough for me." Fred Cameron is the pride of Nova Scotia. He is the best runner the province has ever produced. He is one of Jack Canuck's loyal sons, and although it might benefit him financially to become a naturalized citizen of the United States, he prefers to remain a Canadian.

With beard unkempt and hair uncut, after living for the past month with murderers and thieves, eating nothing but dry bread and milkless tea, with a daily plate of soup, Frank Bowden, imprisoned for owing the town of Glace Bay \$430 for taxes, left the county jail again a free man. About a month ago he had been sent to jail for non-payment of taxes, to remain there until he had the required money. His bill, originally but \$4.30, had increased 22c. a day for board, so that the sum collected by the printers and presented to jailer Karm made no less than \$11.48. Bowden had formerly been employed as a linotype man by the "Standard" at Glace Bay, but when that paper ceased publication he was left without a position, and while looking for one had been grabbed for taxes, and having no reserve funds was landed in jail, where he remained till yesterday, and where he would have been yet had it not been for the good work of Rev. Mr. Kinsale, who on Wednesday last discovered him there and started in to obtain relief. After being released yesterday he was taken to Mr. Kinsale's residence, where he was very kindly received, given a letter for Mr. McLean of the S. and L. at Glace Bay, and incidentally some refreshments and some money, and put on the road for Glace Bay and steady employment. Before leaving for the "Big Town" Mr. Bowden, who, by the way, has a wife and family in the old country, intimated to a representative of the Post his wish to express through the columns of the press his extreme gratitude to those who had helped raise the money for his release, to Rev. Mr. Kinsale, and to any others who may have had to do in any way with his regaining his freedom.—Sydney Exc. (Mr. Bowden was formerly a resident of this city.

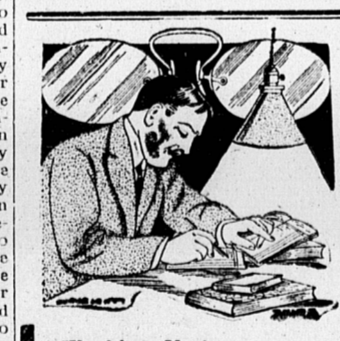
A very interesting game of football took place yesterday afternoon between the North Enders and the second Alerts in which the Alerts won by a score of 6-0. Knight of the North Enders made some fine tackles but couldn't cross the line.

The following schooners have arrived at Sydney:—Schr. Happy Go-Lucky, 36 tons, Capt Allen, from Montague, P.E.I., with potatoes, turnips and beets; Schr. Three Bells, 92 tons, Capt. Murray, from Crapaud, P.E.I., with potatoes and turnips; Schr. Ida, 53 tons, Capt. Williams, from Charlottetown with potatoes, oats, turnips and other produce.

The report of the department of Indian affairs issued at Ottawa, Nov 7, for the year ending March 31, estimates the Indian population of the Dominion as 118,261, of whom 4,600 are Eskimos. The increase of births over deaths during the year was 346, showing that the prevalent idea that the Indian is gradually disappearing is not sustained by the facts. The Indian population by provinces is:— Alberta, 3,988; British Columbia, 24,581; Manitoba, 6,104; Nova Scotia, 2,026; New Brunswick, 1,802; P. E. Island, 292; Ontario, 22,496; Quebec, 11,482; Saskatchewan, 9,439; Northwest Territory, 12,625; Ungava, 1,246; Yukon, 3,100; Eskimos, 4,600.

An exchange says:—Claude Oran Frood, the player whose presence on the Fredericton Capitals a few years ago turned "amateur" hockey in the Maritime Provinces inside out, is likely to play in the East again. If stories now going the rounds are correct, Frood will be with the New Glasgow team in Nova Scotia this winter, playing in the Eastern professional league. It is said that Chester Gregory will probably be at the head of the playing end of the New Glasgow team, and Frood is not the only Upper Canadian player likely to be there. George Stuart, another member of the old Capitals, is likely to be at the head of the new club at Stellarton, N. S., and the rivalry between Stellarton and New Glasgow is expected to be keen. Mike Murphy's services are said to be in demand by several of the Nova Scotia clubs, but he says that he will not sign up for less than \$50 per week. While no official announcement has been made as yet by the promoters it is said that the professional clubs in the Maritime Provinces will not take up the plan of playing six men on a team, as adopted by the National Hockey Association, although the idea should be better suited for the small rinks of the East than for the bigger sheets of ice in the National Association circuit. (Mr. Gregory referred to is a native of this city and Mr Frood's escapade in the N. S. & N. B. league of some years ago will be readily recalled by local followers of the winter game.)
