REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE PREPARATION OF CONSULAR INVOICES COVERING SHIPMENTS OF LIVE FOXES

All Consular Invoices presented for shipments of live Foxes to the United States during the coming season should be prepared in accordance with the following directions. It should be noted that the market value of the principal market value of the principal market of Prince Edward Island, or the export value, whichever is the higher. 1. Individual foxes or pairs should be designated as "Pups," "Proven Breeders," or "Non Breeders." 2. If the male or female have been paired or mated for breeding purposes, it should be so stated. Otherwise they should be designated as "Lone Female" or "Lone Male." 3. The score of each fox should be stated, whether above or below 85 points. If the box has not been scored, then the score in the opinion of the shipper should be given. 4. Names of varieties of foxes should also be stated. 5. The actual price of each fox or pair must be given, as average prices on a shipment cannot be accepted. 6. If, through the making of an adjustment, through friendship, or for any other reason, the price paid or received is below the export price, both prices should be shown. 7. If the cost of crates, or any other expense incident to the shipping of the foxes after the purchase has been made are included in the invoice, it should be so stated. Shippers or purchasers who are accompanying their foxes should have all receipts, bills of sale, memoranda of purchase, etc., ready for inspection by the appraiser at the port of entry. When presenting an invoice for certification, the original contract, or bill of sale must be submitted, as well as the permit for importation. In addition to the foregoing, the following statements should appear on the face of the invoice. Currency in which the invoice is made.
