KINGSTON, Nov. 20.—The latest reports now are to the effect that the great tidal wave has swept the north and south coasts practically wiping out the towns of Savannah, La. Mar and Lucia both towns of considerable importance.

The reports brought in by the steamer say that 42 were killed at Montego Bay the centre of destruction will be cut off from communication for a week at least. The entire wharf front at Montego Bay was wrecked.

He should also enforce the view that a Canadian contribution in addition to, not in substitution of, a British contribution.

The question of preserving a Dominion Naval unit should be left an open question.

LONDON, Nov. 18.—An agreement of the Home Rule quarrel in the House of Commons was brought about today when the Government announced their intention of reaching an end desired, by more roundabout means and the Unionists having made a good demand for the observance of the precedent raised no objection. The net result of the row will be to delay the progress of the Home Rule Bill for ten days.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 19.—Nasim Pasha the Turkish commander in chief sent the following despatch at 3.30 o'clock this afternoon.

"A desperate artillery engagement began this morning and is being continued with success.

The Bulgarian Infantry operating in front of the centre of the line of defence was repulsed by the artillery fire. Part of the enemy's batteries were silenced.

We ordered a detachment of troops to advance.

They attacked the enemy's entrenchments and forced them to flee.

We captured a number of rifles machine guns, helmets, shovels and pick-axes.

A number of helmets bore the badge inscribed 35th regiment Vrania showing that there are Serbian troops with the enemy.

The battle continues."

Another telegram from Nasim Pasha estimates the Bulgarian losses in Monday's fighting on the Turkish right wing as four hundred killed and wounded. These include twenty officers.

Two machine guns were captured.

OTTAWA, Nov. 20.—It is understood from well informed circles here that there will be radical changes in the Dominion civil service very soon.

Sir Geo Murray the English expert, who has been appointed to reorganize service, has the report about completed. It is understood he advocates considerable change.

MONTREAL, Nov. 20.—Because of the recent riots between McGill students and the Montreal police, it has been determined by the civic authorities to pass a by-law forbidding undergraduates to parade the streets.

In future this privilege will be granted only to religious or patriotic organizations.

LONDON, Nov. 20.—The new financial resolution of the Home Rule Bill was discussed in Committee of the House of Commons to-day. Austin Chamberlain remarked that if Ireland demanded separation she must bear the burden of her own financial responsibilities.

Lloyd-George declared it would pay Britain as well as to have prosperous Ireland as to have prosperous West Indies or South Africa.

Bonar Law pointed out that Britain did not pay old-age pensions in the colonies and there was no sound reason why she should pay them in Ireland.

Sir F. Bannery moved to amend the resolution providing that the payments for Irish services should not involve any charge on the British tax-payers. This was defeated by a majority of 115. The resolution was passed by a majority of 111.

SOFTIA, Nov. 19.—Bulgaria's conditions for agreeing to an armistice were transmitted to Constantinople early this morning. They were accompanied by Bulgaria's main conditions for the conclusion of peace, the principal stipulation of which permits Turkey to retain the city of Constantinople and a strip of coast territory in Europe.

It is understood that the terms of the allies for an armistice are moderate and that Turkey may save Constantinople if she accepts them. Respecting Albania it is said in well informed quarters that the Balkan league probably will not object to that country remaining under the Suzerainty of Sultan and that the powers will acquiesce in this.

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—Gyp The Blood, Lefty Louie, Whitey Lewis and Dado Frank the gunmen charged with the murder of Rosenthal are all found guilty of murder in the first degree in the Supreme Court this afternoon.

The jury was out an hour and ten minutes.

Justice Goff remanded the prisoners until tomorrow morning, when he will fix the date for the sentence.

The entire proceedings in the court after the jury came in occupied only seven minutes.

The gunmen were brought into court by four prison wardens and uniformed policemen.

They heard the verdict with faces unmoved staring straight ahead. On the way back to the cells the convicted men walked erect all except "Whitey" who went with bowed head.

The crowd in the court room received the verdict without demonstration and the news caused no visible excitement, when it reached the throng outside the building.

The counsel announced he would appeal from the verdict and as in the Becker case it may be months before the ultimate fate of the men is decided.

OTTAWA, Nov. 21.—Action which it is believed will have an important bearing on Fisheries in Maritime Provinces has been taken by the Department of Marine & Fisheries by the passage of an order in council authorizing the establishment of an advisory fisheries board with the idea of developing fisheries on the Atlantic.

Prince Edward Island will have one member on a board of thirteen.

The Board will meet yearly in Ottawa and outline plans for the development of fisheries.

It is expected that valuable information will be secured and the department will be in a position to do more for the industry as a result.

Officials of the department will have seats on the board and the other thirteen members will be representative of the fishing industry.
