**WHERE WOMEN VOTE,**

In Colorado, Idaho, Wyoming and Utah women are enrolled as voters and in the recent elections they evidently voted to some purpose. They defeated Governor Peabody in Colorado and elected Alva Adams to that high position. Peabody had the support of a majority of the men but Adams secured a larger majority of the women. In Utah the heavy vote cast for the new American or Anti Mormon party was largely made up of women. In Idaho, we are told the women voted quite as generally as the men and in Wyoming they were also out in large numbers and contributed powerfully to defeat the gambling license movement which was an issue of the campaign.

These elections were fruitful of minor incidents not always of a pleasing character. In Colorado, at a place called Midway a male deputy sheriff named Doyle objected to the official conduct of Mrs. Kennedy, one of the election judges, and at the conclusion of the argument slapped her and tore her dress. Further particulars are wanting. In Boulder, another Colorado town, where two years ago scarcely a woman voted who was not brought in a carriage, this year "they walked like the men." In Pueblo, Colorado, Mrs. Nora Light, a prominent Democratic worker, was placed under arrest for "making a row." In Denver Mrs. Nellie G. Cox when asked to swear to her qualification was unable to take the oath, not having been a resident for six months and "broke into tears." This evidence of weakness, we are told was "routinely denounced" by other women, and some went so far as to declare her "a disgrace to her sex." But we have only the newspaper reports of these incidents and newspapers are mostly made by men!

**PORT ARTHUR'S STRENGTH.**

Marshal Kodama, chief of staff of the army besieging Port Arthur, recently told a correspondent that he had troops enough to take the fortress, having about 60,000 to the 20,000 in the garrison. He says three to one is sufficient even when the splendid defences of that place are considered. In fact it would be impossible to use more men than the besiegers now have. The siege and its results have become a question of strategy, tactics and engineering.

The Russian forts are built on the best model. All is changed since the Japanese captured Port Arthur ten years ago in one day. Then a single fort was the key to the whole position. Now it cannot be said that any single fort is the key. All are so arranged that they must be captured in detail. The capture of one only means the capture of that individual fort. Marshal Kodama admits that the besiegers have found it exceedingly difficult to locate any weakness in the chain of fortifications on the landward side, while from the sea the fortress is absolutely impregnable.

The forts facing the sea are iron plated. The garrison, secure against attack from the sea, have turned their naval guns to account to reinforce the forts on the landward side. Japan has in turn brought from home naval guns and coast defence mortars to use in the siege. "I wish," said Marshal Kodama, "I could bring all the world's tacticians to witness these lessons for future warfare. The question is, are our naval guns and guns of position, and reinforced field artillery more powerful than the Russian naval and coast defence guns now reinforcing the forts?"

Tunnels are now being driven with immense labor through the rock towards several of the Russian forts. It will be an almost endless task to reduce all the forts one after another in this way. It has now become apparent that a mistake was made by the besieging army and fleet in not enforcing a strict blockade from the first. For months after the siege began supplies of food and even of ammunition were run into the fortress. This is now pretty nearly cut off and most accounts agree that the garrison are feeling the strain of short supplies severely. By this time had all supplies been cut off from the first, Port Arthur must probably have fallen. How long it may yet hold out is as much a problem as at any date since the siege began.
