GROW POTATOES NOW

Patriotic Duty of Farmers—Best Kinds For Ontario

Canada is not in danger of a food shortage, such as menaces Germany and gives incentive to her farmers. But Canadians who grow potatoes are likely to find a large and profitable market, and besides they will render a national service. Every dollar of material wealth added to the resources of the nation at this time is a factor in winning the war. The Ontario Agricultural Department urges care in putting in of the crop, and offers personal advice to growers based upon experiments conducted at the college in recent years. There are far too many varieties of potatoes grown on the farms of Ontario. This is one of the greatest weaknesses in the potato industry of the province. Varieties prominent in the experiments at the college and in the co-operative experiments throughout Ontario are the Empire State, the Davies' Warrior, the Rural New Yorker No. 2, the Green Mountain and the Carman No. 1 of the late, and the Extra Early Eureka, the Early Ohio and the Stray Beauty of the Triumph of the early varieties. Use smooth, well shaped, sound tubers of good size and of the best varieties. Throw the freshly cut potato sets into finely ground land plaster and plant them immediately after being cut, says the Department. Drop the pieces separately from 12 to 15 inches apart in the rows and have the rows 25 or 30 inches apart. The potato sets can be planted from three to five inches deep, depending upon the character and the condition of the soil. Level cultivation frequently gives the best results on a light soil, and ridged cultivation on soil of a heavier nature. It is often an advantage to expose whole seed potatoes in a subdued light in a warm room about three weeks before planting, thus producing short, thick, green sprouts.

PRIDE IN BICYCLES

It seems now that some people are quite satisfied if the wheels will go round, however complacently, and disregard the fact that the extra labor involved in propulsion is the penalty paid for neglect. This studied carelessness has to a large extent been responsible for the cheap bicycle, and the foolish suggestion often heard that all machines are alike. If we could only eradicate this neglect, we should soon be able to prove that only the best in bicycles is good enough; is really the cheapest, and worth care and attention.

New Brakes Needed

One automobile expert writes: If the connections have been fully taken up and have gotten to the end of their tether when full force of the brake is required, or are anywhere near it, either new brake blocks are required or the band needs relining. This is a thing that, for the sake of safety, should not be put off to that indefinite to-morrow which may never come. In testing the efficiency of an adjustment, little dependence can be placed on the method of jacking up the car and hauling a wheel around by hand against the brake. Such a method might be effective if a ten or twelve-foot lever could be applied to the spokes, but the best course is to see how it acts on the road against the engine and to see how great a distance is required to stop the car from a speed of twenty or twenty-five miles an hour.
