GOOD WORDS FOR THE TUNNEL.

The St. John Telegraph returns to the Tunnel question, arguing that the work must be built and that it will prove a paying enterprise. There is nothing half-hearted in its statement:

"If the Prince Edward Island Tunnel would pay its way, if the need for it, the benefits arising from its construction, and the justice of the Island's demands for it, be admitted, it must be built. The Tunnel would pay, beyond reasonable question. The Dominion has already paid the Island a million dollars in recognition of Federal failure to provide the continuous steam communication between the Island and the mainland guaranteed under the terms of Confederation. Not only did the Dominion thus confess the justice of the Island's claim but it opened the door for future claims of the same character. The million was only a payment on account. All this time perhaps the aspect of the Tunnel question which has most interested New Brunswick and the other provinces is the financial one."

Our bright St. John contemporary credits The Guardian with having "forced the Tunnel into the theatre of practical politics," as we have tried to do, and quotes our figures setting forth what the work would save and what it would earn. Thereupon The Telegraph concludes:

"The services which the Government now maintains are wholly unsatisfactory during the winter months. By the same expenditure for interest on the Tunnel the Islanders, without additional cost to the taxpayers of Canada, would receive almost incalculable benefit, in comfort, in pocket and in prospect. If we accept The Guardian's figures as fairly accurate—and they appear conservative enough—and consider also the increase in the Island's prosperity which the Tunnel would cause, it easily follows that the work would be justified even if it cost \$15,000,000. New Brunswick and Nova Scotia would feel the beneficial effects very quickly. The politicians cannot afford to overlook The Guardian's Tunnel figures."

These are good words and forceful and our Island readers will appreciate them. They were prompted by a kindly feeling toward this Province and its people, no doubt, but the conclusion reached is precisely that to which all must come who are animated by a sense of justice and who will fairly and dispassionately consider the situation and the facts.

AMERICA'S ANSWER TO JAPAN.

President Roosevelt adheres to his purpose of sending the nation's battleship fleet to the Pacific ocean, and on as far as the Philippines next winter. It was the attitude of Japan over the treatment of the Japanese in California that brought him to this resolution. Having whipped China and Russia, and being possessed of the only considerable fleet in Pacific waters, Japan has become arrogant and dictatorial, say the Washington authorities, and therefore Japan is to be confronted with a stronger fleet than her own, right at her very doors.

But this is not the whole of it. With the battleships will go a number of fighting cruisers making a fleet of about thirty ships of the line, nearly one-third more in the aggregate than Japan's

naval fighting strength. It is not merely a cruise. The United States will hereafter maintain a big fleet in Pacific waters, and this involves the creation of another fleet for the Atlantic. This is given out as the President's purpose. The old building program will be departed from and a number of large new battleships are to be ordered at an early date. Canada has also a Japanese question on hand and is not wholly uninterested in the movement of the big fleets, which will be at once an answer and a wholesome object lesson to Japan.

THE NEW ICEBREAKER.

A London cable tells that tenders will be called for the construction of a new winter steamer for the Northumberland Straits, the contract price to be from \$400,000 to \$450,000. This price ought to bring a powerful boat, but it cannot be here to be put to use before the winter of 1908-9.

We have little confidence that the third steamer will keep up the service so as to fulfil the terms of union, but it was asked for to assist in the work till the Tunnel can be built. It ought to be provided for this winter. The Ottawa Ministers ap-

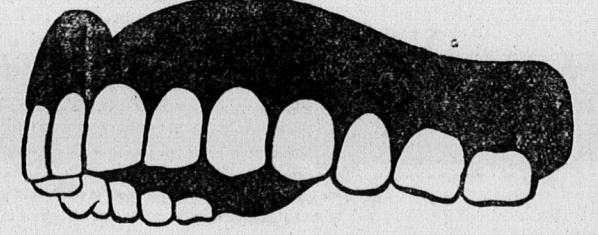

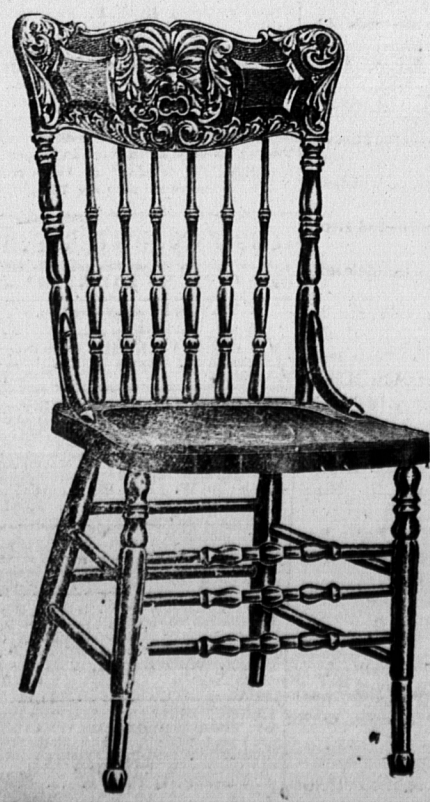
