#### Fascists Change Offensive

ROME, March 25.—Marshal Pietro Badoglio has switched his offensive to the fertile Ethiopian plains in the extreme northwest near the boundary of the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan, a War Office bulletin indicated today. A Blackshirt column occupied the village of Kafa, about 40 miles south of the Eritrean border and an equal distance east from the Sudan, the communiques said.
