LONDON, Feb. 3.—(CP)—Three members of the staff of the British legation at Athens who, after escaping to Crete when the Germans invaded Greece, risked their lives to save other members of the Legation staff, have been awarded the M. B. E. (Member of the British Empire).

They are: Tyrrell Carlisle and Edward Patrick Dillon got to Crete by boat and learned that another boat carrying most of the staff had been sunk by enemy action and that the party was stranded on an island between Greece and Crete.

Taking food and medical stores, the three men went to the island although they were in constant danger of bombing, and rescued all the party.
