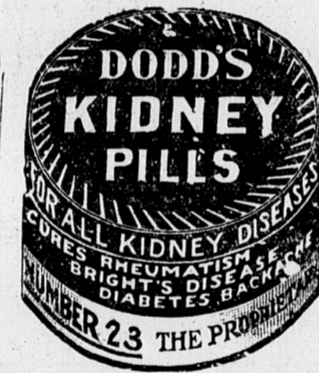

A PROVINCIALIST VISITS THE WEST

(Continued from page three.) hundreds could be seen sitting around the base, and Franklin's statue, besides hosts of other historical places.

Leaving Chicago Mr Wood proceeded to Boston, stopping off at Olean, N. Y., where Walter B. Judson, met him with his auto and they drove to his home in Eldred, Pa. a distance of seventeen miles. Mr Judson and his brother, John W. Judson are sons of Jacob W. Judson of Alexandria, and operate a big patent and enameled leather factory.

The process of making leather was extremely interesting.

Salted hides, either from Chicago or imported from Europe are used and soaked. When fit they are removed and then limed for nine days to take off the hair after which they are put through a machine to take off the remaining hair, then through another machine with revolving knives to remove the hair and flesh from the meat side, then put in a bote wheel to remove any lime left in, after which they are colored in a weak tan liquor, made out of bark ground in another machine like a large coffee mill. After they are colored they are hung in vats eight or ten days, where the tan is kept in motion, sometimes being pumped off and new liquor being put on. They are then taken out and put in a process like a big cider press to squeeze out all the extra wetness, then turned out on large machines to remove the wrinkles or creases. They are then selected for whatever kind of stock most desirable, or needed or split into pieces and then put through a machine with an endless knife revolving like a band saw and separated into four, or five thicknesses. Another with a rigid knife takes the grain part off the hide and removes a piece of leather like tissue paper without a hole and running fifty or sixty feet. After being split the hides are returned to the tan yard where a coating of cod oil and degre or wool grease is applied and they are tacked on frames which stretch them out flat and tight. When dry they are softened and patched if necessary and sent to another shop where they are put into a composition made up of, boiled linseed oil, Lamp black and other materials are then applied with brushes. The heat is about 140 degrees in the furnaces and it is a hot place to work in. All colors are made here from the smooth black to the fiery red leathers for automobiles. Before shipping, to get the size of the hides, a machine with movable pins is used. So many pins means so many feet and all the operator has to do, after placing the hides under the frame, is to count off the number of feet, requested on a dial. I saw about one hundred men at work and they tell me that one hundred and fifty will soon be on the pay roll. After the extremely bad business of the past two years they now have more orders than they can fill and are putting on new men every day, and ordering new machinery to work with. Prices of machinery run up to \$1500, for fleshing machine the prices run from \$1700 down to \$650.

Most of the work is piece work. They take on men, teach them the work, and after learning they go on piece work and earn as much as they can. One peculiar thing I noticed was that all the men are young, not an old man in the place and all were expected to work or quit. The buildings covered over an acre of ground themselves and several acres of ground are used to dry the leather in the sun. Most of the buildings are three stories and are fully equipped with a fire sprinkling and hose system. One building is 410 feet long. One pump alone pumps 500 gallons of water a minute

In the Glass Works the manufacture of glass was seen from where the raw material was thrown into the furnaces, until it came out the finished product in large sheets of glass ready to be cut into panes of any desired size. In the process natural gas is used and over thirty men are employed in the factory. In the furnace the heat registers 2,350 degrees and the glass can be seen in the liquid form.
