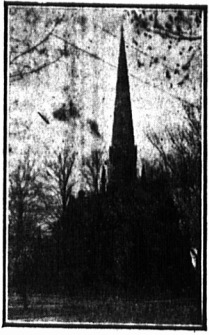

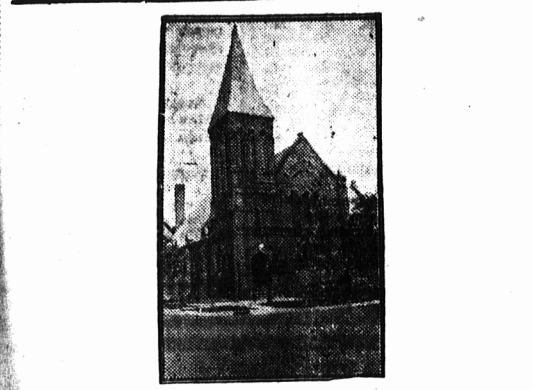

Spraying and dusting materials are sold under trade names which cannot be used in this department. But the materials most in favor are: For control insecticides, nicotine sulphate, pyrethrum and derris. For poison, to be eaten by the insects, arsenic in some form. For fungicides, sulphur. Inquiry for these three classes of material will quickly inform you of the various trade names under which they are sold; and each preparation has instructions for its use which should be carefully followed.
