## Apps' Unassisted Overtime Goal Gives Leafs 2-1 Win Over Americans

NEW YORK, Nov. 21—(CP)—Syl Apps' overtime goal gave Toronto Leafs a 2-1 victory over New York Americans in a National Hockey League game here tonight.

The win was Toronto's fifth straight, and left them still on top ahead of Detroit at the top of the league.

Apps, Toronto's all-star centre, fired the winning goal at 1:16 of the overtime after Red Dutton's team overtook the Leafs to a standstill and seemed destined to earn a tie with a rookie goal-leader backing them up sensationally.

Twenty-year-old Charlie Rayner of Kenora, Ont., a junior in amateur ranks last season, made a big holding the Leafs to two goals. He rolled the injured Earl Robertson and performed as capably as Robertson or any other experienced big-leaguer could have.

Gordon Drillon beat the youngster in the first period, taking a relay from Wally Stanowski and Nick Metz, and skating right up to the New York doorstop before shooting. Rayner had little if any chance on the blinding shot.

Johnny (Peanuts) O'Flaherty, rookie right-winger, tied the score in the second period on a pass from Charlie Conacher. There was no scoring in the third stanza, although the Leafs came dangerously close on a number of occasions.

The overtime session had hardly started, however, when Apps swung through the New York defence, fought his way to and within a few feet of Rayner, and smashed home the winning goal.

Audience thrilled a crowd of 4,000 with a rousing display against the league-leaders. They had near-

DETROIT, Nov. 21—(CP)—A second-period goal by Gus Giesebrecht broke a 1-1 deadlock and gave Detroit Red Wings a 2-1 victory over Montreal Canadiens in a National Hockey League game here tonight before a crowd of 10,464.

Sparkling play in the nets by Johnny Mowers, the Red Wings' rookie goalie, kept the cellar-dwelling Canadiens in check except for a first-period goal by Tony Demers.

That score, a waist-high shot that whistled past Mowers, came with less than three minutes of play remaining in the period, and after Demers had skated half the length of the ice after taking a pass from Jack Adams.

Detroit, the surprise team of the young N.H.L. season, had opened the scoring when, with sub left-winger Archie Wilder in the penalty box, Mud Bruzeteau dashed nearly the length of the rink to drill the puck past Bert Gardiner, a play on which Jack Stewart and Jimmy Orlando drew a assist.
