DIFFERENCES OF OPINION AS TO WAR CLAIMS

PARIS, Feb. 12.—The Reparation Commission of the Peace Conference has before it three propositions as a basis for the settlement of claims against Germany...

The British plan, proposed by Premier Hughes of Australia, differs from the French only in that he makes no reference to any class of claims.

The Americans plan opposes any demands excepting losses by pillage and devastation.

Total claims under the first two plans are estimated at a thousand billion francs; the American plan would reduce the total to an amount Germany probably will be able to pay.
