FARMERS DO NOT GET A FAIR SHOW.

The other day at the directors' luncheon in the Toroneo exhibition, after hearing much about the farmer's happy lot from other speakers, a real farmer got the floor, and with a resolute front asserted that the men of the farms do not get a square deal. He pointed out that every other industry was protected, and some of them bonused besides while the farmer got no real protection but had to bear the burden and pay the bills.

The census that was specially taken in 1906, five years after the last Canadian census, showed that but 2,957 natives of this Province were in the Northwest, while there were 6,728 Icelanders. The three Maritime Provinces together were represented in the Northwest by only 12,461 persons in 1906, or less than twice the number who had come from Iceland alone. The large exodus from Eastern Canada has evidently not all or nearly all, gone to the Canadian prairies.
