# MESSENGER OF DEATH

Removes C. E. Stanfield Founder of

## TRURO KITTING MILLS

Which is now Being Conducted by his Sons—Former Resident of Tryon.

A year's illness of more or less severity terminated by a very sudden attack of two or three days, carried off early yesterday morning to his long home, our well-known and highly respected citizen, C. E. Stanfield, Esq. We have lost one of the sterling men of the town, and together with an immediate family of a widow, five daughters and four sons to whom we extend sympathy, we deeply mourn his death.

Mr. Stanfield was born in February 1828, at Wakefield, Yorkshire, England. He was the eldest son of the late John Stanfield, of that place. He belonged to one of the oldest families in that country—a prominent Truro business man, who was born at Knottling, but 12 miles from Wakefield, says the Stanfields were one of the oldest and most respected names in Yorkshire.

Mr. Stanfield was ambitious, and thought he could do better in the "New World" so in 1854 he came across to the United States. His old British traditions did not find much congenial air among our cousins who by the way are far more agreeable cousins now than in those days so he soon left that country and settled in Tryon, P. E. Island where in 1857 he married Miss Lydia Dawson, daughter of the late Thomas Dawson, who survives him. Here he established a successful woollen mill but finding the market too small removed to Truro the year the Pictou Branch of the I. C. E. was flushed and opened a manufacturing business on the South side of the railway tracks at the Truro Station in connection with the British American Hat Company.

Mr. Stanfield a little later started the well known woollen mills at Brookside, afterwards the property of Messrs. Blair, Little & Cook.

For two years he had a most successful business in St. Croix, Hants Co., and thereafter he established the Hat Factory in Truro that he afterwards sold to Messrs Craig & Webster.

In 1882 he organized and started the well known and successful knitting mills now conducted by his sons, John and Frank, under the title of the Truro Knitting Mills Co.

In all the enterprises Mr. Stanfield showed a decided business tact, and an almost entiring energy. He was a soul of honesty. No more unassuming nor unostentatious man ever lived in Truro. Until illness prevented he was a member of a regular worshipper in St. John's Episcopal church.—Truro News 24th.
