SOLDIERS' W. LEAGUE

Give Each Man a Knife.—
Some Interesting Correspondence.

The members of the Soldier's Wives' League, desirous of remembering Capt. Moore and the men of the South African Constabulary from P. E. Island before their departure from Halifax presented each man with a nickel-plated pocket knife. Through the kindness of Mr. E. W. Taylor the knives were suitably engraved with the name of the recipient on one side and the initials "S. W. L." and "P. E. I." on the reverse.

These knives were extremely useful and strong and it is thought that no more appropriate gift could have been presented to them. The following letter of the Secretary to Capt. Moore and his reply will be read with interest:
