BRITISH RULE IN INDIA IS ASSAILED

PARIS, July 21.—By an ironical coincidence the Daily Mail last week published a severe arraignment of Belgian rule in the Congo, and the Eclair published a not less scathing impeachment of British rule in India.

"Virtually the whole land—namely the Congo—has been monopolized," says the Daily Mail, "for the benefit of European investors."

"The English," says the Eclair, "regard India solely as a place out of which money can be squeezed."

The Daily Mail refers to the cruelty and misrule under which the native population of the Congo is suffering. The Eclair remarks that "a few weeks ago five natives were flogged to death by the English in Nigeria, this fact being admitted in the House of Commons by the Secretary of State for the Colonies."

The parallel between the two articles is so close in fact that the one in the Daily Mail might appropriately be headed:

"As the English See Others," and the one on the Eclair:

"As Others See the English."

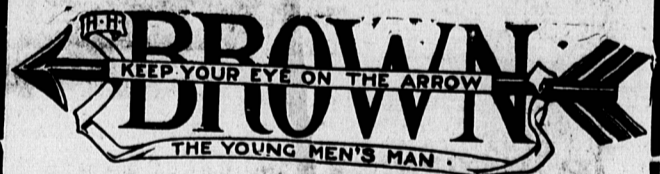
