"I write books," replied Davis. "Why?" countered the eminent celestial, "Aren't you strong enough to work?"

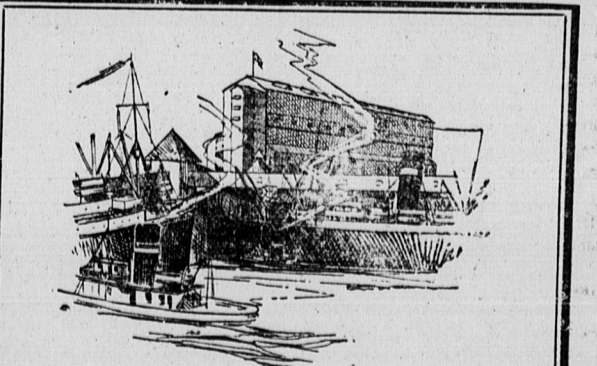
