HOW TO WIN

Third grand prize, a \$800 Karn-Morris player piano supplied by Miller Bros. In addition to these prizes there will be a first district prize consisting of the \$475 Willis piano, supplied by A. E. Toombs. Three of these pianos will be given away, one in each district to the highest vote getter after the grand prize winners have been decided. There will also be a second prize in each district consisting of a \$150.00 Grafanola, supplied by A. E. Toombs. These three Grafanolas will be awarded to the second vote getter in each district after the Grand Prize winners and the First Prizes in each district have been decided. Third and fourth prizes will consist of Diamond Rings and Gold Wristlet Watches, supplied by G. H. Taylor. Those not winning any of these prizes will be given a cash commission of 10 per cent. on the amount of mo-

ney turned in by them in subscriptions, provided they remain at it until the close of the contest.

The conditions are simple. You have only two things to do. First, send in your application, using an application blank, or write a letter to the Contest Manager. Second, let your friends know you are entered in the contest and want to win one of the prizes.

A vote coupon will appear in all issues of The Guardian, and will be good for one vote. There is another way to get votes—lots of votes—and much faster than cutting out the Voting Coupons that are printed from day to day. Paid-in-advance subscriptions to The Daily Guardian and Weekly Guardian entitles the person securing them to a handsome bonus vote as described in the schedule on the next page.

To aid the contestants in getting subscriptions, a supply of subscription blanks will be sent to every contestant as soon as entered.

In forwarding a large number of voting coupons, do them up in bundles containing 100 coupons each, mark the name of the candidate, also the number of votes contained therein on the outside coupon, and in this way it is not necessary to write the name upon each separate coupon.

In sending in your subscriptions make your remit-

tances by express or post office money order or by check. Do not send cash except by registered mail. The subscription must not be handed to a newspaper dealer, but forwarded to the Contest Manager with your remittance covering the amount of the subscriptions.

The special ballot attached to the subscription blank should be sent in to the Contest Manager with the subscription as it is not valid until signed by the Contest Manager. This special ballot will be deposited in the ballot box at once or be returned to the candidate to be voted later, upon request.

Any man or woman who wants to enter this contest and feels uncertain about it, should write to the Contest Manager. All letters of enquiry will be promptly answered.

Once nominated, make up your mind to win, and lay definite plans for a systematic campaign. It is system that will bring you a prize: not hit-or-miss efforts.

Get some friend to act as your campaign manager and help you arrange a methodical canvass for votes.

Let all your friends, relatives and acquaintances know that you are in the contest, and that you are determined to win. Don't be afraid to ask them to help you by securing subscriptions and saving coupons.
