CHAPTER XIV

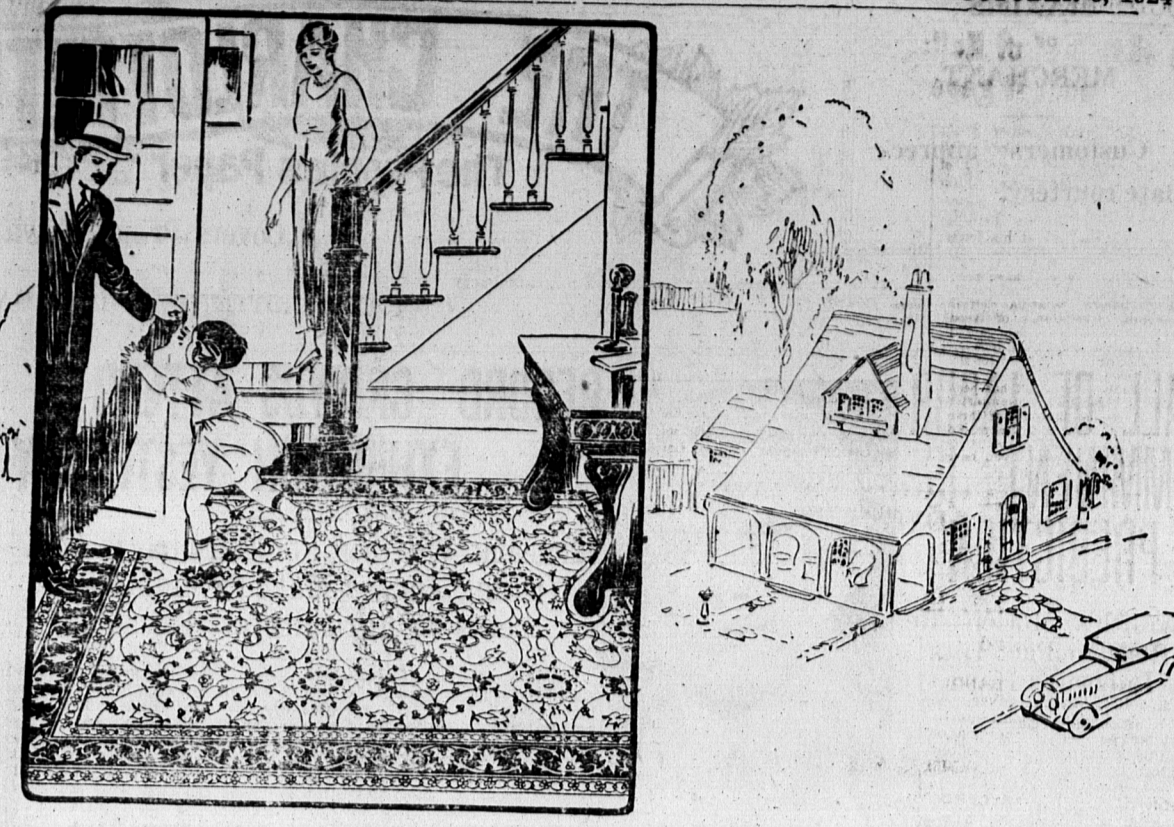
THE CONVERT
