TERRIBLE ENDING TO A LITTLE JOKE

DETROIT, Aug. 12.—Frank J. Cook, aged 35, and Daniel Veerland, aged 30, special detectives for the Lake Shore railroad, were shot and killed last night by Special Officer William Burnett, aged 38, of the Michigan Central railroad, on the Michigan Central tracks near Junction avenue.

The men met death as the result of a joke that they attempted to play on Burnett. They were all on the beach at the time and met at the junction of two roads every night. Last night Cook and Veerland, knowing that Burnett had trouble with two car-breakers, decided that they would hide behind a car and spring out on him as he passed.

STEPHANO SINKS TUG IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK, August 13.—Yesterday morning the Red Cross liner Stephano, for Halifax, as its head swung clear of its berth at that line's dock in the East River, on the Brooklyn side, and was proceeding on its course for Halifax, struck squarely amidships the steam tugboat Henry W. Stanwood and cut her in two, sinking her in less than five minutes to the bottom of the river, just north of the Brooklyn bridge.

The captain, Michael Tierney, Pilot Thomas O'Leary, and two of the crew were slightly injured by the crash, the former having his head cut open, and when they were picked up by rescuing boats he was unconscious.

The tugboat was towing a barge loaded with sand and got bunched with several tugboats going in different directions ahead of the Stephano. The accident was stated to be due to whistles. No lives were lost and the misunderstanding of signals and the misapprehension of the Stephano's position proceeded. The tugboat was valued at \$10,000. Hundreds of people on the two bridges witnessed the accident and the rescue of the shipwrecked crew.

An investigation will be held to place responsibility by the underwriters and the harbor authorities.
