Splendid Pensions For Canadian Soldiers

(Canadian Press Despatch)

MONTREAL, September 22.—J. K. L. Ross chairman of the board of pensions commissioners, in addressing a recruiting meeting on behalf of the Irish-Canadian Rangers in Dominion Square here tonight, announced some interesting figures of pensions for soldiers and dependents, for total disability, rank and file, the pension will be \$480 a year; squad commander, sergeant-major, color-sergeant, or other sergeant, \$510; regimental sergeant-major, \$620; lieutenant, \$720 captain, \$1,000.

Those entitled to be awarded pensions are divided into six classes: 1st class, for total disability, 100 per cent; 2nd class, 80 per cent; 3rd, 60 per cent; 4th class, 40 per cent; 5th class, 20 per cent; 6th class, less than 20 per cent.

To each of those up to and including the rank of lieutenant totally disabled, and in addition totally helpless, a further allowance, not exceeding \$250 a year may be made. Those up to and including the rank of lieutenant disabled and entitled to a pension in the first three classes shall be paid, in addition to the personal pension, a special allowance of \$6 a month for each child he has.

If a member of the forces is killed his widow is entitled to 80 per cent of the full pension for life, or until she re-marries. If she marries again the pension is to be paid to her for one year afterwards and then it ceases. The widow is entitled to draw an allowance for whatever children there are up to the age of 16 for a boy, and 17 for a girl. If a widower is killed in the army service each of his children is entitled to \$12 a month. A widowed mother or step-mother or a grand-mother who is wholly dependent on the member of the forces killed, is to receive 60 per cent of the total disability pension. This also applies to a father totally dependent upon a son killed in the service.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. Homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions, a habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

British Red Cross Appeal for Oct. 19th

The following appeal has been received by Lt.-Col. Jenkins: Toronto, Sept. 20th, 1916.

Dear Sir or Madam:—The necessities of the British Red Cross Society and of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem in England are so great, and the work undertaken by it so extensive, that it has been found necessary to again appeal to the Dominion of Canada for assistance in an Empire-wide movement to collect funds for the sick and wounded.

Lord Lansdowne, the President of the British Red Cross Society has, therefore, issued an appeal to our Society for such help as it is within our power to give in the collection of funds, and the 19th of October has been fixed for the day upon which such an appeal should be made to the people of Canada.

The Executive Committee of the Canadian Red Cross Society is in hearty sympathy with the movement, which will be extended to all the Dominions beyond the Seas, and is desirous that the Canadian Red Cross Society, shall make, on that day, a response worthy of the people of Canada, and our Society.

It has been decided to leave to the Provincial Authorities all arrangements necessary for the successful carrying out of the object in view, as the appeal has been made to H. R. H. the Governor General and the Lieutenant Governors of the several Provinces, but it is hoped that the Canadian Red Cross Branches will give every assistance to local Committees which may be appointed by the Provincial Authorities.

The Executive, therefore, commends this appeal to you in order that steps may be taken to organize at once in such a manner as to produce the best results.

It must be clearly understood that the money collected for this Fund should be altogether the result of a special appeal on that day, and that grants should not be made from the already subscribed funds to the Canadian Red Cross Society in the hands of the several Branches.
