Choice Ontario Cheese in Ingersoll is now worth 11 1/2 cents. Poor stock may be imported from the Upper Provinces but dealers in Halifax will not resort to this as long as they can get the Island stock. Cheese is about 1 1/2 cents per pound higher this year than last. This means quite an item to the dealer on a 70 pound cheese.—Halifax Herald.

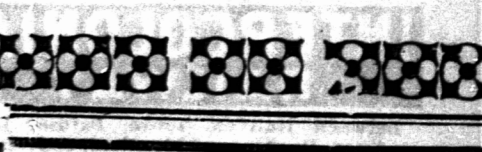
